

- 2. Faculty, staff, and students are consistently reminded to disconnect and switch off electrical devices when not in use or after use, contributing to energy conservation. Display boards in each classroom reinforce this practice by promoting electricity-saving habits.
- 3. The campus has enhanced its energy efficiency by installing solar panels and routine maintenance checks on various equipment ensure optimal performance.

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
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

- The staff and students are advised to promote the usage of public transportation.



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


Outcomes:


