Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>Planning and scheduling lectures - The college follows the academic calendar of Mumbai University and plans the syllabus completion in accordance with the same. All the subject teachers are required to prepare the teaching plans of their respective subject at the beginning of the semester. The teaching plans are documented properly. Coordinators and the Principal verify and approve the same and see that the syllabus is completed according to the teaching plan. A separate Google drive is created and shared with all the faculties for updating on a daily basis. The college has a separate Timetable Committee wherein the members of the same prepares the timetable on time and is shared with all the beneficiaries. Faculties are motivated to attend FDPs, workshops etc. in order to equip them with the updated pedagogy of teaching. Expert lectures are arranged for various subjects by renowned resource persons to equip the students with the recent and advanced topics.</p> <p>Remedial lectures and Tutorials- Faculty members take utmost care to complete the syllabus on time. Tutorials/projects, class tests and internal assessments constitute the formal evaluative processes, but students are always encouraged to meet the faculties beyond classroom hours for doubt-clearing and academic discussions. Faculties engage extra lectures on holidays as well as on Sundays to complete the syllabus allotted to them in case required. Assignments in various forms are collected from the students. Remedial lectures and tutorials are also conducted to support weak students and in certain subjects for all. Effective Mentoring is in practice in the college in order to help and support weak students.</p> <p>Course Material – All the faculties provide learning materials either as hardcopy or soft copy. Efforts are taken to improve the writing habits of students. The college library is well equipped to cater to the needs of students and faculties which have sufficient textbooks and reference books. Faculties also encourage the students to write their own notes. Assignments and presentations are part of the teaching learning process. This helps to develop thinking, writing skills along with gaining confidence and getting a deeper understanding of the subjects.</p> <p>Infrastructure - The College arranges necessary IT infrastructure like Projectors and Smart boards to facilitate new generation teaching learning process. The lectures during Covid-19 pandemic were delivered online wherein the institution readily purchased paid Zoom links for facilitating uninterrupted learning process. The faculties recorded their lectures and uploaded the same in YouTube and shared the links through Whatsapp groups with the students.</p> <p>Certificate course and Research projects- The institution also offers Certificate courses in various domains for the students. Some of these courses are conducted by In-house faculties and some are conducted by outside experts. Proper syllabus is framed and approval is taken from the College Development Committee before the start of the course. Research project is part of the curriculum in various undergraduate and post graduate courses. All the faculties are involved in guiding the students for completing their research projects and inculcating research interest among the students.</p>
