

- 3. Advocacy: Volunteers were inspired to advocate for environmental conservation and promote green initiatives within their communities, fostering a culture of environmental stewardship.







Judging Criteria: Posters were evaluated based on visual impact, relevance to the theme, creativity, clarity of message, and adherence to competition guidelines.


Exhibition and Prize Distribution: Completed posters were displayed for viewing, followed by a prize distribution ceremony to recognize and reward the winners.

Coordination and transportation logistics sometimes presented obstacles in mobilizing volunteers and conducting sessions in remote areas.


#### **Conclusion:**




### **Description of Activity:**



**Blood Donation drive at College campus** 



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




