The meeting concluded by vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Sumi at 3 pm.












Since there was no other matter to discuss meeting ended at 4pm with vote of thanks by Dr. Hinchaji Seichand











MINUTES OF THE WORKSHOP

A National Level Research workshop on Preparing Effective Research proposal & Funding Agencies for Sponsorship was held on 28th July 2023 from 11.00 am to 01.00 am through the Google Meet Platform, by Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce IQAC and Research Cell in association with Sree Narayana Guru College of Education (B.Ed.)

The Prayer was followed by a General Welcome for all the participants, the keynote speaker and the heads of the institutions given by Dr. Sumi Nijith. A welcome address was given by The Principal of Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce, Dr Ravindran Karathadi. The Principal of Sree Narayana Guru College of Education (B.Ed.), Dr. Anna Fernandes spoke about the importance of Research. Introduction About the Workshop was delivered by Dr. Jayasree, the Vice Principal, of Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce. Introduction of the Keynote Speaker, Dr. Maushmi Datta, The Principal of Nagindas Khandwala College (Autonomous) was given by Dr Karishma Kasare.

Dr. Maushmi Datta, enlightened the participants with the nuances of preparing a research proposal scientifically and systematically. She emphasised upon the purpose of academic research is to seek the truth and new knowledge which enhances social development. She focused the participant's attention on the format of a research proposal for funding. She in detail differentiated the Ancient Research Proposal Structure and Modern Research Proposal Structure.



Under Modern Structure, Dr. Maushmi insisted that the project title should be framed with not more than 10 to 15 words, which should also be brief, clear, meaningful and easy to remember. She provided few examples for better clarity regarding the project title. She explained that, The Introduction of the topic should be written as a brief background of the study and why is it essential to research the topic. She further discussed the key sections of a proposal such as the core of the research which is The Problem statement, Research Objectives/Research Questions/Research Hypothesis, Review of Literature, Research methodology, Relevance of the proposed study and its Implications.

Dr. Maushmi emphasised the importance of a Literature review as, it is a discussion of gaps in research, it is a critical and analytical account of the existing research on a particular topic. The related literature can be searched from Google Scholar which is a subset of Google Web Search, which helps us to refer to the scholarly literature, including papers, theses, books and reports. The related literature review should include both old research and current ones for understanding the gap in the research carried out. The Methodology was discussed in detail such as the coverage, data source, data collection both primary and secondary and the data analysis. References and plagiarism were also explained. She threw light upon the Proposed Budget, Time frame, etc which should be mentioned in detail so that the funding agencies will get a clear picture of the proposal and approve it.


The entire session was very interactive. Dr. Maushmi was constantly asking questions to the participants and ensured their participation. The PPT prepared by her with suitable images and minimal text was very attractive and at the same time very informative. The question-answer session was fruitful as many doubts were clarified. The workshop ended with a vote of thanks given by Dr. Rashmi Agarwal. An online feedback form was shared with the participants to be filled out for further improvement and to know what was the takeaway from this session. The participants were ensured that they will receive an e-certificate for their participation. Dr. Maushmi was instrumental in motivating many young minds to start thinking seriously about doing research.

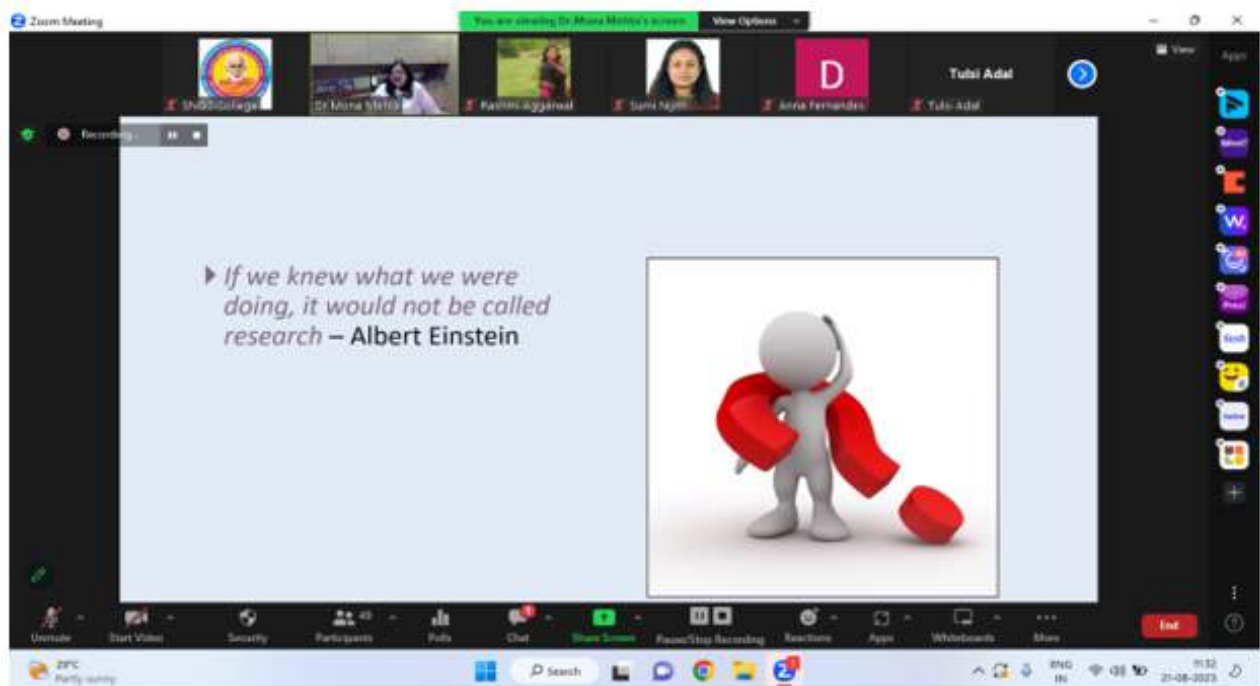


REPORT ON FDP DAY 1

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BRIEF REPORT ON THE 5TH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ORGANISED BY IQAC, LIBRARY, DEPT. of IT AND DATA SCIENCE ON 16/9/23.

The IQAC, LIBRARY, DEPT of IT and DATA SCIENCE department jointly organised the 5th International Conference at the seminar hall on 16/9/23. There were 44 registrations (1 INTERNATIONAL, 7 FROM OTHER COLLEGES) and 37 research papers which the committee is trying to get published in the UGC CARE journal.

The Keynote address was delivered by Dr. Sarbani Banerjee Belur, Senior Research Scientist of IIT, Bombay and the technical session was chaired by Ms. Sonali Kanekar, Librarian of NK College.

DETAILED REPORT OF THE POST LUNCH PRESENTATIONS

The Technical Session Programme of the International Conference on “Latest Digital Applications in Teaching and Library Management” was commenced after a short lunch break at 1:30 PM by Mr. Yash Surve who hosted it. Ms. Mehjabeen Khan then welcomed and introduced the Technical Chairperson of the session, Ms. Sonali Vhatkar, after which Ms. Naveena Suresh who gave a brief announcement for the felicitation of the Technical Chairperson, which was conferred to Ms. Vhatkar by Ms. Vandana Gupta.

The Technical Session then commenced at 1:40 PM with Dr. Sumi Nijith being the first to present her paper titled “A Study On Virtual Evaluation In Education”, speaking on how it assists in education, and how standardisation is required for fair evaluation in virtual and digital learning. The second presentation was by Ms. Sneha Sachin Jagadale who discussed the topic entitled “Critical Analysis Of Ai Tools In English Language Teaching” covering the potential of such AI tools in education as well as in English language teaching, concluding on how AI tools should assist teachers, not replace them.

The third paper was presented by Ms. Naveena Suresh, titled “A Literary Based Study On Understanding Whether Artificial Intelligence Will Create An Employment Crisis Or Not For The Coming Generation Of Students” who did an international level analysis, considering data from India as well as Dubai with her co-author, and discussed how technology can increase workplace convenience but human intervention is necessary to keep the AI in check, and concluded on how AI can increase employment opportunities for students. Dr. Karishma Kasare followed with the fourth paper of the session titled “A Study On Impact Of Parental Involvement In Digital Learning On Students Academic Performance



With Special Reference To High School Students” aiming to study digital literacy among parents, and whether digital learning adversely affects reading performance among students, concluding that digital learning has a positive impact on students.

Mr. Priyadarshan Shede and Mr. P. Iyer's paper titled “A Study On Open-Access Learning Tools And Online Education With Special Reference To Individuals Trading / Investing In Stock Market” was presented next with observations ranging from the higher impact of such tools below 45 years of age and that it confirms to be affordable and reliable in the Chembur region. This was followed by Dr. Hosamani's paper titled “Digital Content Management Issues In Libraries: A Study”, exhibiting Digital Content Management's many benefits, and showing its eco-friendliness. This was followed by Dr. Rashmi's paper

presentation titled “Embracing The Future: The Unveiling Of AI's Role In Education” enlightening us on different applications of AI in teaching and warning us on the ethical use of AI.

The next paper presentation was done by Ms. Rishita Shukla whose paper was titled “Impact Of Social Media-Based Learning On Students's Street Food Preferences: A Case Study In Mumbai” who highlighted how digital education can correlate to real life preferences, and how social media plays a role in preference making by students. This was followed by the paper presentation by Ms. Prabha Jasmine who presented “A Study On Digital Vs. Traditional Learning Tools: Analysing Students Adoption And Reason For Adoption” by finding a comparison between digital and traditional learning preference among students and showing how both the forms have merits though students prefer traditional forms. Mr. Saranraj Natarajan presented his paper titled “A Study On The Impact Of Ai-Powered ChatGPT On Student Learning” next showing the familiarity of ChatGPT among students though there are mixed reactions and there's a need for balance in its use for learning and teaching.

Mr. Swapnil Pradeep presented his paper next, titled “An Analysis Of Students Behaviour On Online Learning” highlighting student behaviour as key factor for online course engagement, and there should be courses designed for personalized learning. The next paper was presented by Ms. Kavita Singadiya, titled “Use Of Digital Tools By Higher



Education Teachers In Research” highlighting preferred tools by educators for various applications. This was followed by the paper presentation by Ms. Manali Kotkar, whose topic was “Recent Trends In E Learning Using Web 4.0”, highlighting various aspects of Web 4.0 including block-chain technology in the e-learning process. Ms. Beena Pandey followed next with her research paper titled “Digital Aids In Teaching And Evaluation - Students Perspective” wherein she discussed digital tools in learning, compared to traditional tools being equally viable and that digital tools have a future.

The next presentation was done by Ms. Nahid Shaikh, with her paper titled “Role Of IOT In Education” which enables students to have a more modern learning environment, and that it will cause a shift towards the digital learning experience. Ms. Saba Shaikh next gave her presentation on “Assessing The Impact Of Swayam App On Students’ learning: A Study

Of Accessibility, Engagement And Learning Outcomes” pointing out about access, equity and quality while using SWAYAM and a holistic development from the platform.

This was followed by the paper presentation by Mr. Alwyn Carvalho whose topic “Exploring The Potential Of E-Books For Enhancing English Language And Literature Pedagogy And Promoting Environmental Sustainability” tried to ascertain how e-books contribute to better comprehension to English Language and Literature learning as well as greater convenience of weight and promote better sustainability than print books. Mr. Nizamuddin Shaikh followed with his paper presentation titled “A Study On ‘Evaluating How Youtube Supports Remote Education: Accessibility And Student Performance’” which covered how YouTube helps in competitive exams, and how it helps to understand topics better and in enhanced learning among students.

Ms. Mahtab Khan presented her paper next, titled “Effectiveness Of Ai-Powered Virtual Assistants In Enhancing Classroom Learning: A Student Engagement Analysis” which explains how AI helps students with better engagement, and improves academic

performance, showing its potential in enhancing education. The next paper was by Ms. Mehjabeen Khan whose topic was “Exploring Ai-Generated Explanations For Mathematics Problem Solving: Enhancing Conceptual Understanding” which tries to explore how AI can help with mathematical explanations as well as help to solve its problems. Ms. Angel Nadar

presented her paper next, entitled “A Study Of Current Trends In Virtual Delivery Of Education” which highlights how students prefer IT tools in learning, and also explained the challenges in connectivity and awareness which needs to be created for online courses. The next presentation was done by Ms. Punam Mujawar with her paper “A Study On Use Of Cloud Computing In Sports Education” which mainly explored how cloud computing assists in learning of sports. This was followed by the presentation by Mr. Mohammed Jabir whose paper “Chatgpt Vs. Traditional Teaching: A Comparative Study On Student Engagement And Learning Outcomes” highlights the importance of diversity in learning as both ChatGPT and traditional methods are both preferred among students, and suggests the need for a blended approach towards AI. This presentation was succeeded by Dr. Sreedevi VS whose paper was titled “Artificial Intelligence In Teaching Mathematics”, concluded that there are benefits of applying AI to maths, and that personalised learning and immediate feedback are some of its benefits. Ms. Reshma Jinwal presented her paper next, titled “Study Of Digital Tools For Effective Teaching” which highlights different uses of digital tools in the classroom and that it redefined the educational landscape, leading to more engaging, accessible and positive learning outcomes.

Dr. Devaki Shetty next presented her paper titled “The Impact Of Digital Tools Used By An Educator For Teaching Accountancy In Higher Education: A Comparative Study” which primarily focused on the use of digital tools for teaching accountancy. This was followed by the paper presentation by Dr. Pushpalatha Rajan from the B.Ed. section whose topic was titled “Role of Assistive Technology & Artificial Intelligence in Creating an Inclusive School” which especially explored the use of assistive technology and its use for differently abled children and students who require more attention. Lastly, the final presentation was done by Mr. Yash Surve whose paper, titled “Research On The Effects Of Educational Technology Tools On Student Learning And Educational Outcomes” tried to cover how EdTech improves academic performance and how faculties and students should improve on EdTech tools to improve its quality and impact on students.

After the paper presentations were completed, Mr. Yash Surve invited Ms. Sonali Vhatkar to give a review on the quality of the presented conferences. Ms. Sonali conveyed corrective measures to the faculties, providing valuable insights on how a conference must be



differently presented than a lecture and how each part should be mentioned including the introduction, review of literature, citation of sources and credits to the authors who contributed towards the development of the paper to avoid plagiarism. The three best papers selected by Ms. Sonali are of Ms. Prabha, Ms. Saba and Dr. Rashmi.

Towards the conclusion of the conference, Ms. Naveena welcomed the Principal, Dr. Ravidran Karathadi for bestowing the certificate of appreciation to Ms. Sonali Vhatkar. This was followed by Mr. Yash inviting the faculties to receive certificates for the presentation of the papers, which were conferred by the Principal, Dr. Hinduja and Ms. Sonali.

Ms. Naveena proposed the Vote of Thanks, especially extending her heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Sarbani Banerjee, the Keynote Speaker of the Morning Session, Ms. Sonali Vhatkar, the Technical Chairperson of the Afternoon Session, our Principal - Dr. Karathadi, our Vice Principals - Dr. Hinduja and Dr. Jayasree, and all the faculties who assisted in making the conference such an enormous success.

The conference was adjourned at 3:45 PM with tea and biscuits served for the faculties and students who attended the conference.

**A Report on the 6th Multidisciplinary International Conference on “Multifaceted
Bridging the Gap Between Industry and Academia”**

Every country’s growth and development depend on skilled human forces. Industry and academia must align to bring sustainable development. In the Indian scenario, industrialists express dissatisfaction over the unskillful workforce due to the lacuna in the curriculum. Considering the need of time, the 6th multidisciplinary conference was organized by research cell and IQAC in collaboration with Sree Narayana Guru College of Education and Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai on “Multifaceted Bridging the Gap Between Industry and Academia” on 20th December 2023 in hybrid mode.

The conference started with introductory remarks by Dr. Rashmi. She welcomed all dignitaries and participants and gave an overview of the conference with a focus on the purpose of the conference. It was followed by the ceremonial lighting of lamps by the dignitaries and prayer song.

O.K.Prasad sir supported the views shared by Ms. Soni Sharma by stating the need for collaboration between industry and academics. He expressed that the sustainable growth of India depends upon the development of students through quality education.He said that students should diagnose the problems of students and help them to excel in all regards so that they would be industry-ready. He also added that SNMS management always supports students' development and helps them to get better placement. He concluded his speech by wishing grand success to the organisers of the conference.

Dr. Sumi gave an overview of the conference proceedings. She said that academia is theoretical, whereas industries are more practical, thus filling this gap is vital. Considering the gap between academia and industries, the 6th international conference was organised. The conference received 63 research papers across states and from abroad too.

**Report of University Level Workshop on Educators' Awareness Workshop on
NEP2020: HEIs Preparedness on ABC (Academic Bank of Credit)**

New Education Policy was released on 30th July, 2020 with the motto of Educate, Encourage and Enlighten. Though many scholars have provided critical analysis of NEP, there are various doubts in the minds of educators. Higher education institutes have been trying to get clarity about their roles and implementation of NEP. Aligning to the goal of understanding and implementation of NEP, IQAC and Department of Commerce had organized a University Level Workshop on Educators' Awareness Workshop on NEP2020: HEIs Preparedness on ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) on 16th January, 2023 at 10:00 am in Seminar Hall of SNGC.

Principal K. Venkataramani was the keynote speaker of the workshop. He has enormous experience in the field of teaching. He actively worked as NAAC Peer Team member. He is an erudite with a clear understanding of NEP and its impact on HEIs and HEIs' role.

Dr. Hinduja addressed the participants and gave a general idea about the workshop. It was followed by the lighting of lamps by the dignitaries. Next to this, Prin. Dr. Ravindran Karathadi talked about NEP and its relevance in current scenario. He also discussed importance of NEP and its impact on HEIs. It was followed by introduction of the keynote speaker by Prof. Jaysree V. and felicitation of keynote speaker by Principal.

Prof. Venkataramani discussed NEP from various angles. He covered various features and evaluation of NEP. He talked about the new academic structure. It will consist of Foundation stage (3-8 years), Preparatory stage (8 -11 years), Middle stage (11-14 years), and Secondary stage (14-18 years). He further highlighted objectives of NEP such as human, especially transgender, empowerment, gender equality, standardization of academic quality. He also focused on provision of education at foundation stage through mother tongue. He mentioned that girls in remote places are not allowed to travel that results into discontinuation of their education. Thus NEP has made arrangements to provide education up to 5th standard in the locality of students.



Prof. Venkataramani explained the meaning and relevance of ABC registration. He said that students need to earn 120 credits to get a graduation degree and 130 credits to get honors degree. He further added that these credits will be added to their ABC account. Parent institute will transfer the credits earned by the student to other institute in case a student continues the education in that other institute. He mentioned that it is going to be very beneficial for the students who discontinue their education because of some reasons. He also highlighted that these credits earned by a student would be valid only for 7 years. He expressed his joy by stating that Mumbai University had already started the process of ABC registration. He added that credit system is applicable only to the courses recognized by UGC. He expressed that students would get liberty to select courses and institutes as per their choice. He explained credit system by stating that a student could take admission in a parent institute and simultaneously he could also do a course from IIT. He said further that students could also do courses on SWAYAM and MOOCS online portals to earn credits. Sir said that students would be given a smart card which they could use in various situations such as taking admission, interviews etc. So there would not be any need to carry hard copies of the original documents. Sir also talked about National Academic Depository which is a centralized depository. Sir said that once the degree is received the total process of credits would come to an end and students could take admission to another course.


Question- answer session was held next to keynote speaker's presentation. Participants asked questions related to issuing of degree, cancellation of admission, minimum credit limit, mandatory credits, ABC registration of foreign students, enrollment limit of students from other colleges etc. Their questions were satisfactorily answered by the keynote speaker.

The workshop was attended by 102 participants. There were 26 in-house faculties, 10 faculties from other colleges and 66 students from our college. It was well received and appreciated by all participants.

The workshop ended with vote of thanks by Prof. Devaki Shetty.

A Report on 4th International Conference on “Path towards Multi Trillion Economy with Reference to India”

David Cameron says “The economy is the start and end of everything. You can't have successful education reform or any other reform if you don't have a strong economy.” The quote states importance of a strong economy. If we relate this to India we can understand the success that India had achieved so far to become a strong economy. It is also essential to understand India's journey towards a multi trillion economy in a near future.

Keeping the goal of understanding various facets of India's journey towards a multi trillion economy, IQAC and Research Cell in association with Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai organized a 4th International Conference on “Path towards Multi Trillion Economy with Reference to India” on 28th January, 2023.

The conference was graced by the esteemed presence of Shri. O.K. Prasad, General Secretary, Sree Narayana Mandir Samiti and Shri. V.V. Chandran, Treasurer, Sree Narayana Mandir Samiti, Dr Sangita Pawar, HoD, Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai. Dr. R. He said that 4% of girls were not allowed to be born. So he asked what the money does for gender equality. Dr. Sumi Nijith introduced the key note speaker Dr. Narentharan Kaliappan, University Uttar Malaysia. Dr. Narentharan spoke on "Enhancing Bilateral Ties between Malaysia and India". He added that MICECA resulted into increase in India's imports from Malaysia by \$5.9 Bn. and exports by \$3.12 Bn. He further discussed Bilateral Trade Agreement and its output. He briefed about Malaysian companies in India and Indian companies in Malaysia. He further spoke about higher education cooperation between Malaysia and India. He mentioned that approx. 3000 Malaysian students are currently studying in India while about 1500 Indian students are studying in Malaysia.

The inaugural session came to an end with vote of thanks by Dr Hinduja, IQAC Coordinator, SNGC.

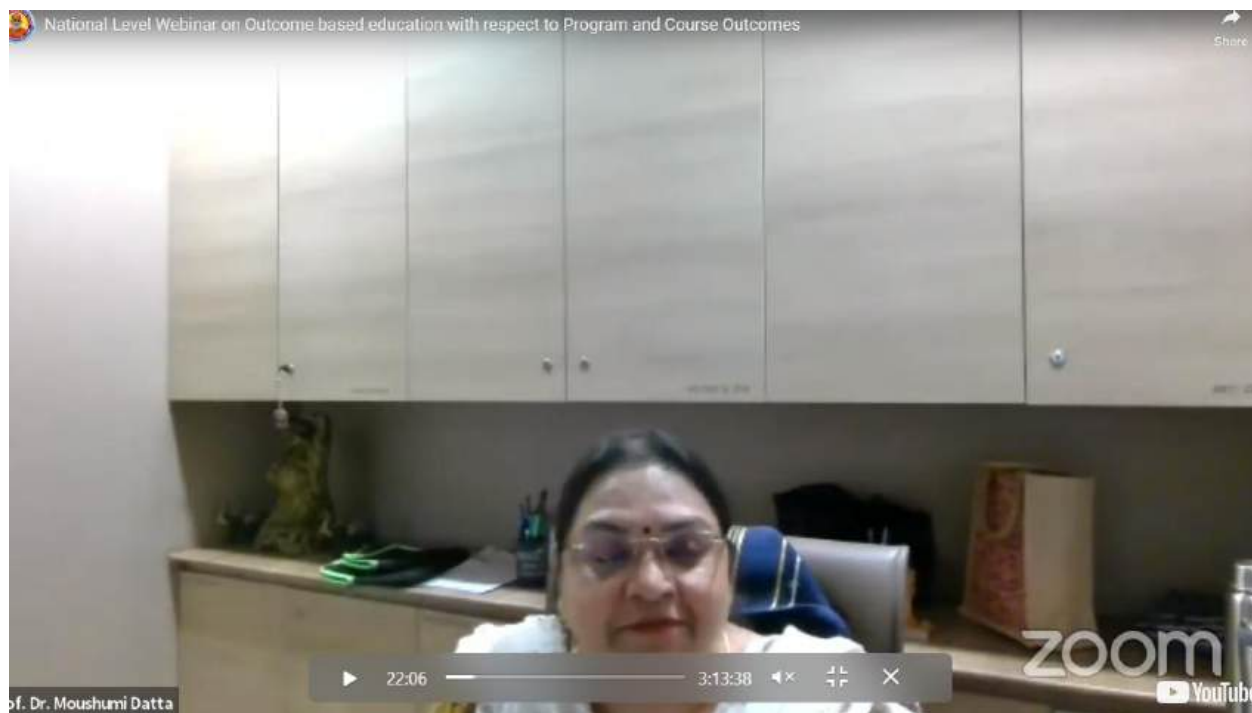

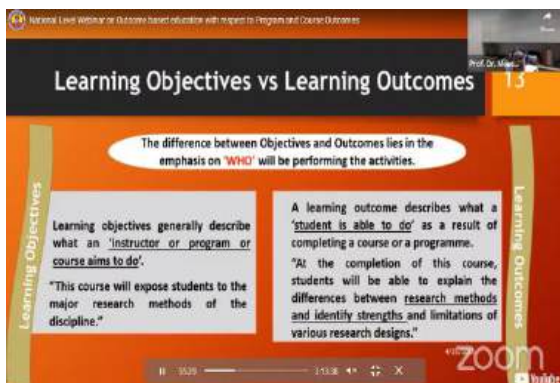

Report of One Day International Seminar

On

“Resilience and Reinvention of Global Economy in the Context of Covid 19: A Multidisciplinary Approach”

Report of One Day National Seminar On

“Changes in Economic Policies in India since 2014- Implications and Challenges, a Multidisciplinary Approach”

Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce in association with IQAC organised One Day National Level Seminar on **“Changes in Economic Policies in India since 2014- Implications and Challenges”** on **22nd February 2020**. Prof. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai, Mr. Dhananjay Sinha, Shree N. Sasidharan, President, SNMS, Shree Gopidas, Assistant Secretary, SNMS and Dr.Ravindrana Karthadi, Principal graced the occasion. Prof. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai, the Vice-Chancellor of Somaiya Vidyavihar University and Provost of Somaiya Vidyavihar, Mumbai, was the chief guest for the seminar and Mr. Dhananjay Sinha, Head of Strategy Research and Chief Economist at IDFC Securities, was the keynote speaker for the seminar.

The inaugural function started at 10 am in college seminar hall. Chief Guest, Prof. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai, Mr. Dhananjay Sinha, Shree S. Sasidharan, President, SNMS, Shree Gopidas, Treasurer, SNMS and Dr.Ravindrana Karthadi, Principal inaugurated the function with the lighting of lamp.

Principal, Dr.Ravindrana Karthadi, introduced college to the dignitaries and participants. He expressed that Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce was founded with the aim of uplifting the socially backward strata of the society. He further gave a glimpse of college infrastructure, college’s development, facilities and courses available at college. He also gave his remarks on the theme of the seminar. He stated that economic development was not progressive in last two decades. He also mentioned that demonetization resulted as an utter failure of the government whereas GST surpassed the difficulties faced in the initial stage.

Shree N. Sasidharan, President, SNMS, blessed the occasion by sharing his valuable thoughts. He highlighted vision of college as disseminating education to students irrespective of their class, caste and religion since 1968. He specified that 7500 students had enrolled in the college. He further added that the college is located in the underdeveloped area to help the marginalised through education. He also shared his views about slowdown of economy, recession etc. He stated that social, economic development of the society could be done only through educating the young minds.

Convenor Dr. Sumi Nijith delivered the welcome address in inaugural session of National Seminar. She spoke about various policies implemented by the government since 2014. She presented a critical analysis of the economic policies declared by the government. She concluded that the technical sessions had been designed for a critical evaluation of economic policies adopted by the government.

Prof. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai, the Vice-Chancellor of Somaiya Vidyavihar University and Provost of Somaiya Vidyavihar, Mumbai, was the chief guest for the seminar. He discussed various economic policies declared and implemented by the government since 2014. He pointed out that demonetization resulted as a total failure. Agrarian sector was adversely affected by demonetization. He also mentioned that government faced many troubles and challenges while implementing GST; it seemed a failure in the initial stage but now it has turned out as one of the remedies to boost Indian economy. Prof. Pillai stated that the government had achieved a mix up success of the policies announced and implemented. He suggested that problems of micro economics must be considered in a country like India to boost the economy. Prof. Pillai highlighted the need to understand cultural, social and economic context in India for the overall social development. In addition to the views expressed on economic policies, Prof. Pillai discussed the purpose of IQAC and emphasized the need of developing and maintaining quality in the institutions and the need of quality assured research.

Mr. Dhananjay Sinha, Head of Strategy Research and Chief Economist at IDFC Securities, was the keynote speaker for the seminar. He addressed various issues of Indian economy since 2014. He discussed his views on 'Is India's Growth Slowdown Structural or Cyclical?' He covered major economic variables like GDP, foreign trade, savings, investment, inflation and unemployment. He did a comparative study of international economy and Indian economy. He highlighted the recovery from the recession of developed economies like USA, Britain, Japan, France etc. and mentioned downward trend of Indian Economy. Mr. Sinha concluded that Indian growth slowdown was structural.

The inaugural function ended with the vote of thanks by Prof. Jayashree V.

Dr. Sarswati Moorthy, Associate Professor, R. J. College Ghatkopar, Mumbai, was the chairperson of the first technical session. There were twenty presentations by the researchers from various colleges. Prof. Moorthy in her remarks appreciated and congratulated all the researchers for their fresh and new topics with different perspectives. She gave a review of all papers presented in the session.

Dr. Ravi Shukla, Assistant Professor, R.D.National College, Bandra, Mumbai, was the chairperson for the second technical session. There were fifteen researchers who presented their papers. Dr. Shukla in his remarks gave a glimpse of all presentations. He appreciated the researchers for their new topics. He was impressed by the thorough research done by the faculties and also by students. He congratulated the college and the convenor for conducting the seminar successfully.

Second technical session ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Dr. S. Hinduja.

The Seminar was a huge success as **thirty-five participants** presented the papers and **twenty-seven** papers were published in the UGC Care-List Journal- The Heritage. It was appreciated by the chief guest, key note speaker as well as by all the management members.
