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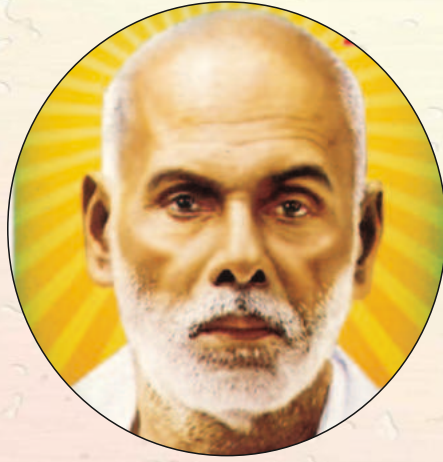

It is well known that the reputation and ranking of an educational institution determine the value of graduates coming out of that institution. These are important criteria which come into play while the graduates apply for jobs or higher studies. The status also significantly influences the various govt. sanctions, statutory approvals, funding and other aspects concerning the institution and its stake holders. The grading assigned to a college by the NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) plays a crucial role in its reputation and ranking.

Sree Narayana Guru College had two cycles of such accreditation in the past and the latest one was in the year 2012. The College had a high rating under the last NAAC accreditation which has since expired. We are in the process of preparing for the next cycle of accreditation which will last for the next five years. In the past five to six years, the college has achieved considerable advancements in terms of infrastructure, facilities, teaching-learning methodologies and extra-curricular activities. It is a golden opportunity for us to project these achievements in our preparation for the new cycle of accreditation so as to enhance the prestige of the college.

The NAAC has recently introduced a new procedure for the accreditation process. It is based on a revised self-assessment process which is both quantitative and narrative. The quantitative criteria are based on measurable achievements for the last five years which make up 70 percent of the assessment. These are valued by a computer software based on the data given by the college. The narrative information constitute the remaining 30 percent of the total score and will be evaluated by a Peer Team of the NAAC visiting the campus for verification and direct interaction with the stake holders. The new procedure also involves a large number of new areas for assessment. It is very important that the data and information given by the college are positive, accurate and objective.

The NAAC accreditation process involves everyone connected with the institution such as the Management, Teachers, Non-teaching staff, Students, Parents and Alumni in both the preparation stage and assessment stage. It should be our collective endeavor to project our college in the right perspective and strive to achieve the highest grade which will be in everybody's interest. The active of all stake holders is solicited in this regard.

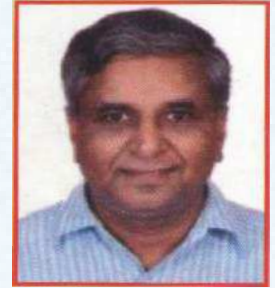

Our volunteers performed two street plays for them: EDUCATE THE GIRL CHILD AND SAVE WATER. It was well appreciated by them. The village has no hospital and qualified doctors. One nurse comes from Govt. hospital at Vangni only on Fridays that too without any personal commitment. Only one primary school is there in Done village that too closed now. Children have to go to Ambernath or Badlapur for a somewhat decent education which is not feasible for many families. No junior or degree college or professional or technical institutions are there in the nearby areas of that village. The education level of the people in the village is very poor and acute unemployment problem exists.

**Tree Plantation:** Tree plantation was organised twice on 03/10/2017 and 23/01/2018, 73 volunteer participated and 80 saplings were planted at the Campus.

## JUNIOR COLLEGE REPORT (2017-18)

It gives me immense pleasure to present the Annual Report of Sree Narayana Guru Junior College of Commerce for the Academic year 2017-18.

**Academic Result:** HSC result for the Academic year 2017 for Commerce was 95.86% with 15 distinctions, 126 First Classes and 160 Second Classes. The toppers were Ms. Pandey Anshika, Mst. Ashok Kumar and Ms. Shaikh Nagma Shabihul Hasan who shared the first Rank in the college with 86.92%, the Second place was shared between Ms. Khan Namira Iqbal Ahmed and Ms. Sauda Simran Shashikapoor scoring 84.46 % and Ms. Shaikh Farhana Faryad stood third scoring 83.08%. The result for Science was 91.79 % with 08 distinctions. The first position was bagged by Mst. Mihir Dakappagari who scored 88.00%. Ms. Tulika Jain scored 87.38 % and Mst Abhilash Bhowmik scored 79.84% and stood second and third respectively.

Our FYJC Commerce result was 90.20%. The 3 toppers were Mst. Gavandhe Manavi Mahendra scoring 84.61% Ms. Ansari Alisha Parveen scoring 83.07% and Ms. Naidu Aishwarya Mohanbabu who scored 81.69%. FYJC Science aggregate was 91.52 %. Pathan Kareena Banoo scored 80.61%, Mohammad Arbaz Shakeel scored 78%, Kadam Uma Devdas scored 77.23% and stood first, second and third respectively.

**Commencement of Academic Year and Welcoming New Students:** The Academic year commenced on 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2017 with regular lectures for S.Y.J.C. students of Commerce and Science. An orientation programme was arranged on 9th August, 2017 for newly admitted FYJC students and the regular lectures commenced from 10th August, 2017.

**Financial Aid:** College helped students to get all eligible free ship and scholarship from Govt. departments as well as from Private Trusts.

**Examinations and Academic Help:** The College arranged remedial coaching, conducted class tests, etc to enhance the students' academic performance at the Board exams. The students of FYJC and SYJC classes are divided equally among the teachers to guide them properly to achieve academic improvement. Three PTA meetings were held for the students of XI & XII after their first unit test, first term and prelim exams. Special Intensive coaching for weaker students of SYJC was held from 15th Jan to 31<sup>st</sup> Jan. FYJC weaker students were given assignments for improvement and this was monitored periodically.

**Staff and Students' Committees:** Students' Welfare Committee was formed for solving the students' grievances and for maintaining discipline. Various Staff Committees were formed for smooth systematic functioning of the College. Meetings of these Committees were held regularly to review and evaluate the College functioning.







**Students Attendance & Punctuality:** Students attendance is monitored meticulously by keeping records for every subject. Monthly attendance of all students is displayed on the students' notice board besides putting up the blacklist. Parents of students whose attendance is very poor were called and given guidance to improve their wards' attendance.

**Cultural Activities:** In Commerce section Div were First runner up in Treasure Hunt in the Inter collegiate Fest conducted by R.R.E.T College, Mulund. Our 5 students of FY & SY competed in Drawing and Essay competition on the topic 'Election' organised by Election Department, Mankhurd. In our Inter collegiate fest 'Oasis' conducted on 15th and 16th Dec, 2017, many students showcased their talents and won prizes in Mehendi, Movie making, All in a minute, Rangoli and Poster making. Speak Well institution conducted English Grammar test wherein Joy Daniel, Gupta Rithika Rajesh and Qureshi Saud won 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize from the Chembur area.

**SANSKRITI'** an intra-mural cultural festival was organized from 4<sup>th</sup> Dec to 6<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2017. Students also celebrated various days such as Friendship Day, Chocolate Day, Band day, Traditional Day, etc. with full enthusiasm. On teachers day students of SYJC conducted lectures in commerce subjects. ## LIBRARY REPORT

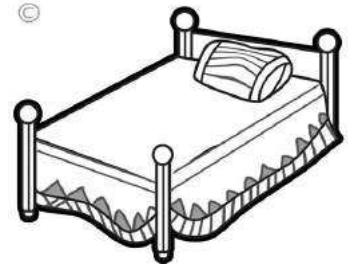
Our college library acts as the nucleus of an institution. This abode of knowledge storehouse has vast collection of information resources in various facets of knowledge. The College library houses more than 23,000 knowledge resources consisting of textbooks, reference books on various subjects, dictionaries, G K books, encyclopaedias, competitive exam books, CD's...etc. User friendly service is the sole aim of the library. In order to make the new entrants know about the facilities, every year library conducts user orientation sessions to all the first year undergraduate students. The library also provides book bank facility to the economically weaker students of the general as well as for SC/ST category students. Every year new titles of the information resources are added to the existing stock taking into consideration the suggestions and requests of teaching and student fraternity. Library has organized book exhibitions by calling the book suppliers (namely Vakratunda Books & Educational Books) on 24-6-2017 and 8-7-2017 respectively which has helped the staff members to select the required books by going through the various book titles exhibited. The exhibition was also visited by the students. In order to facilitate the usage of the e – resources, the library also subscribed to the N – LIST of the INFLIBNET where host of e – journals and e – books available on various subjects. The library procures 11 print national journals and 1 international print journal, 16 news papers and 12 magazines on various titles. Library also has three computers exclusively for use of students and staff and provides internet and photocopying services. During the year 2017 – 18, it has added 1310 textbooks for general use, 846 text books for book bank scheme and 412 reference books to its existing collection.

## IMPACT OF WOMEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP IN INDIA

“You can tell the condition of a nation by looking at the status of its women”  
JAWAHARLAL NEHRU.

Women constitute half of the total world population, so also in India.

They are therefore regarded as the better half of the society. During olden time women were confined to the four walls of home performing household activities. They were looked upon as objects for fulfilling the various roles in a patriarchal society set up. Modern times have witnessed an array of changes in social set up. Now, with education and support from family, they have started plugging into industries also and running their enterprises successfully. They are more liberated and empowered today.

According to the Government of India: - “A women entrepreneur is defined as an enterprise owned and controlled by women having minimum financial interest of 51% of capital and giving at least 51% of the employment generated in the enterprises to women”.

Entrepreneurship is a more suitable profession for women than regular employment in public and private sector since they have to fulfill dual roles. This is specially seen in respect of traditional activities like knitting, pickle making, toy making, etc. and also non-traditional activities like computer training, catering services, beauty parlor, gym etc.

It is clear that more and more women are coming forward to set up enterprises. The emergence of women as a bread earner has led to many-fold impact on the family as a unit and society as a whole. Family is happier with better facilities contributed by the woman, but has to adjust and adapt to her absence from home. It has also learnt to support her by helping in household chores in a responsible manner. Many times her work at home (like cooking, cleaning work etc) is outsourced which creates employment and helps the needy.

While her counterpart has been relieved of the sole financial burden of the family, he has also to adapt to appreciate her and respect her sacrifice for the family. The Me-too movement which has sprung is a mirror of the old mind set clashing with the present role of women. It portrays the changing mental make-up of the woman and the fact that she is, today, an independent person, requiring the same respect and treatment rather than being treated as an object of exploitation. Society is changing and each one has to understand that CHANGE is the only permanent factor. One has to learn and keep adapting, for survival.



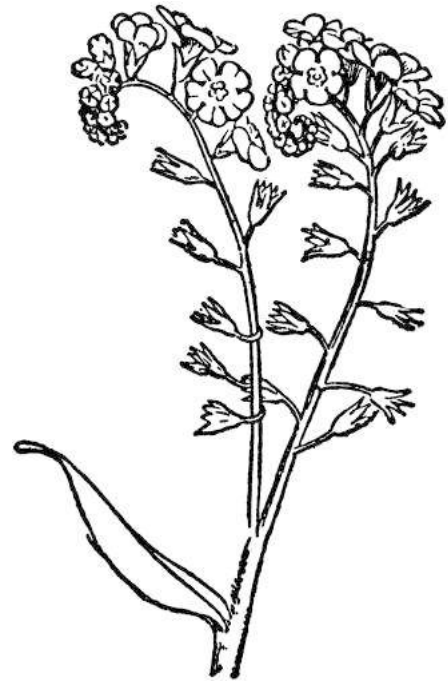

- Be an optimist, be helpful, be positive, be patient. Believe in yourself. Success is yours.



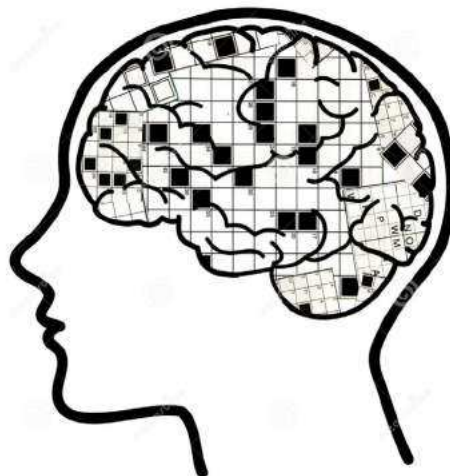

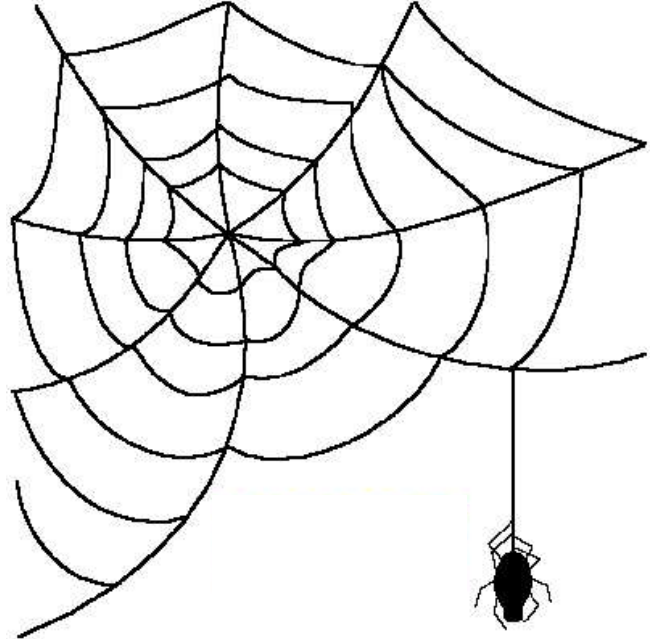




## DON'T DROWN YOURSELF, AND DON'T LET THEM DROWN

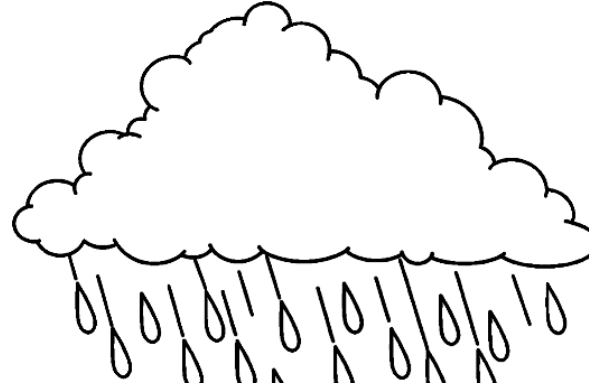

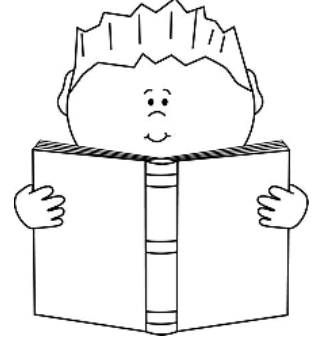

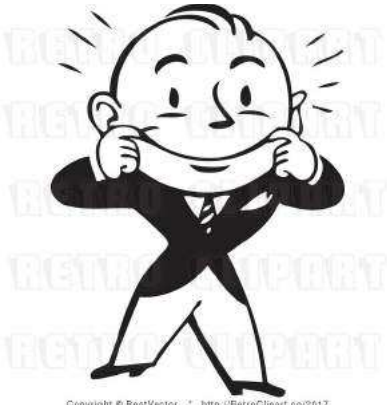

## महिला अधिकार

कानूनी तौर पर महिलाओं को विभिन्न प्रकार के अधिकार:-

- ❖ महिलाओं को बाहर जा कर काम करने का अधिकार जिस प्रकार पुरुष को अधिकार दिया गया है
- ❖ महिला और पुरुष को समान वेतन प्राप्त
- ❖ महिलाओं को केवल न्यूनतम समय तक ही कार्य करने का अधिकार

कई बच्चे परिक्षा के डर से आत्महत्या भी कर रहे हैं। शिक्षामंत्री को वास्तविक शिक्षा पर

पहले तो मुझे इतने प्यार से यहाँ काम करने के चक्कर में लेकर आ गये और उसके बाद कारागिरों के हवाले कर दिया। मुझे पुरे दिन वो सुई नवानी पड़ती की मैं जल्दीसे काम सिख जाऊँ। ऐसे ही कुछ दिन बित गये और मैं काम सिख गया और मुझे १०० रुपये हफ्ता देना सुरू हुआ। पर मेरी हालत एक गये गुजरे इंसान की तरह हो गई थी। ना सही खाना मिलता था और सही से रहना। हम लोगों को ६ बजे सुबह उठना होता था और रात १२ बजे तक काम करना पड़ता था अगर देर से उठता तो लाथ मार कर उठाते थे। ऐसे ही २ साल बित गये थे। (दो साल बाद)

मेरे घर में सब खुश थे और मेरी दोनों बहनों की भी शादी हो गई थी। हर कोई मुझे मानने लगे थे। बस एक मैं खुश नहीं था। मुझे अभी भी समझ में नहीं आ रहा था मैं करना क्या चाहता हूँ। और कर क्या रहा हूँ। मुझे पढ़ने का शौख था और मैं अपनी पढ़ाई छोड़ कर काम कर रहा था। मैं जहाँ काम करता था वहाँ एक स्कूल था। बाजु में जब वहाँ के बच्चों को स्कूल में जाते देखता था तो मुझे हमेशा रोना आता था। मुझे रात में नींद नहीं आती थी बस इसी खयाल में डूबा रहता था।

कुछ दिन बाद मैंने अपनी खाइश एक दोस्त को बताई। वो उस स्कूल में पढ़ता था। उसने कहा बस इतनीसी बात है। ठीक है। कल मैं तुमसे मिलता हूँ। और तुम्हारा नाम लिखा दुँगा स्कूल में। वैसे तुम ने तो ८वी तक पढ़ा है ना।

मैंने उसे सर हिलाते हुए हाँ बोला। ठीक है। मैं कल मिलता हूँ।

आज मैं बहुत खुश था। क्योंकि मेरा दाखिला १०वी में हो चुका था। मैं हर एक सवाल का सही जवाब दे रहा था।

मैं अच्छे पैसे भी कमा चुका था और एक अच्छी बात तो ये थी की मैं १०वीं में स्कूल में पहले स्थान पर आया और मुझे रु. १०००० हजार स्कूल की तरफ से मिला था।

मुझे ये समझ में नहीं आ रहा था कि मैं १०००० हजार को घर भेज दुँ या फिर कोई काम कर लूँ।

तभी मेरे दोस्त ने बताया कि देख, मेरी मान, तो पीसीओ खोल ले। तुझे आगे पढ़ने का होगा तो तु आगे भी पढ़ सकता है। और अभी सब से ज्यादा पीसीओ की चलती है। सब अपने गाँव में बात तो करते हैं। और आजु बाजु कोई पीसीओ भी नहीं है।

उस की बात मान कर मैंने पीसीओ खोल लिया और आज मैं बहुत खुश भी रहता हूँ क्योंकि मेरे सारे सपने पुरे हो गये और मैंने आगे पढ़ने का भी फैसला कर लिया है। शुक्रिया मेरे दोस्त।
