

### SREE NARAYANA GURU (1856-1928)



Sree Narayana Guru was a prominent social reformer, philosopher, and spiritual leader from Kerala, India. He was born on August 20, 1856, in Chempazhanthy, a village near Thiruvananthapuram, the capital city of Kerala. Sree Narayana Guru belonged to the Ezhava community, which was historically marginalized and faced discrimination in the caste-based social hierarchy prevalent in Kerala during that time. He strongly advocated for social equality, education, and the upliftment of oppressed communities. Sree Narayana Guru emphasized the importance of spiritual enlightenment and individual liberation, irrespective of caste, creed, or gender. He worked tirelessly to eradicate caste-based discrimination and untouchability. He established several temples, schools, and ashrams, which were open to people from all castes, including lower castes. These institutions played a significant role in promoting education, social harmony, and the empowerment of marginalized communities. His teachings emphasized selfreform, self-reliance, and the importance of moral values. He sought to eradicate social evils such as caste discrimination, superstitions, and rituals that perpetuated inequality. His teachings and philosophy continue to have a profound impact on Kerala society and beyond. Sree Narayana Guru passed away on September 20, 1928, but his legacy lives on through his teachings, institutions, and the impact he made in the realm of social reform and spiritual enlightenment. He is revered as a social reformer, philosopher, and spiritual guide by millions of people in Kerala and beyond.





# 37th Annual Report

The 37<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of our College provides an overview of the various aspects of our institution's performance and achievements over the past year.

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on students worldwide, leading to various losses and challenges. Shift to remote learning has resulted in a significant loss of classroom instruction and face-to-face interaction with teachers and peers, limited access to technology, and resources, poor internet connectivity, and so on contributed to learning loss mainly to marginalized communities. The pandemic has worsened existing educational inequalities. Students from low-income backgrounds and marginalized communities are the greatest losers. It is important to acknowledge these losses and work towards addressing the impact of the pandemic on students. The College has made efforts to bridge the digital divide and implement strategies to mitigate learning loss which were crucial to ensure students recover and thrive in their educational journey. Teachers were on their toes to help the students in all possible ways to see that they could tackle their difficulties.

During the academic year, the College witnessed a significant increase in the overall student enrolment. The total strength of students across all programs reached a record high of 3,336 showing the growing popularity and reputation of our institution.

**Final-year students' academic performance:** The COVID-19 pandemic created a huge gap in the educational achievement of students across the world besides other losses. The post-COVID period academic result of all colleges was extremely poor. Out of 538 students who appeared for final year undergraduate exams 362 passed giving a passing percentage of 67.29% compared to the earlier consistent result percentage of above 90%. Out of the 647 first-year students, 480 students passed and were promoted to second-year classes giving 74.19% pass and promotion. In the second year out of 574 students, 436 students got passed and promoted to the third-year classes, which is 75.96%.

**Faculty Development Programs**: Our College places great emphasis on faculty development and enrichment. Several workshops, seminars, and training programs were organized by our College and also encouraged our teaching staff to participate in such training programs organized by other institutions to enhance their skills and knowledge.

New UG and PG programmes: The College has introduced two new undergraduate and one postgraduate program after affiliating with the University to supplement the existing 10 UG and 3 PG programs. These additions aim to cater to students' evolving needs and demands and the job market. Recognizing the growing importance of data analysis and its applications across industries, the College has introduced B.Sc. Data Science programme. The program equips students with skills in data collection, analysis, interpretation, and visualization. The College also introduced B.A. Economics program as per the demand of local parents. To enable our B.Sc. I.T. students to





do their post-graduation in their own College we got affiliation to start M.Sc. I.T. programs in our College.

The College Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Research Committee played a pivotal role in fostering a culture of research and innovation among the faculty and students. A substantial number of research projects were undertaken across various disciplines by the students guided by their teachers. The teachers too engaged in research activities, resulting in numerous publications in reputed journals and presentations at national and international conferences. The IQAC organized workshops on 'Cyber Security', 'NEP, Dynamics for teaching fraternity', 'Financial Planning', 'Educators Awareness on NEP 2020: Preparedness of HEI on ABC', IPR', 'Outcome-based Education, etc.


A state-level workshop on "How to Prepare Research Proposals for Getting Sponsorship from Various Government and Non-Government Agencies" was organized on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2022. Dr. Sangeeta Pawar, HOD of the Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai was the resource person. A total of 78 participants benefited by attending the workshop. The Committee also organized a University-level workshop on "Review of Literature" on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2023. Dr. Poonam Kakkad was the resource person. A total of 108 teachers and students participated and benefited. A Research Advisory Committee was formed on 4<sup>th</sup> February 2023 with Dr. Sangeeta Pawar, HOD of the Commerce Department of University of Mumbai as the Chairperson, Dr. Poonam Kakkad as a member, and Dr. Madhu Nair, former dean of Commerce and Management of University of Mumbai as a special advisor.

Four departments of the College have undertaken minor research projects sponsored by non-government organizations and submitted their project reports.

NSS Activities: The College has two units of the National Service Scheme (NSS) with 200 student volunteers. Throughout the year our NSS student volunteers conducted various community service and personality development activities such as Blood donation camps, Thalassemia Check-up, Vaccination drives, Eye check-up camps, cleanliness drives, yoga programs, awareness sessions on HIV & AIDS, Street plays on various awareness topics, Drug abuse awareness sessions, cultural activities, training sessions, Poster making competitions on topics like organ donation, sessions on Cyber Crime and safety awareness, sessions on gender equality, tree plantation sessions, 7 days residential camp at the adapted village, etc.

These activities contributed immensely to benefit the society around the College and also the students to develop leadership skills, social awareness, and a sense of responsibility.

**Community Service Awards**: The College and its students and the Programme Officer of the NSS Unit have received recognition for their active involvement in community service and social initiatives. These awards acknowledge the College's commitment to social responsibility and the positive impact it has made on the local community through various outreach programs and initiatives.





### **Extension Cell:**

The Extension Cell DLLE of the College also organized many sessions and competitions to make our students to be socially responsible citizens.

### **Institution's Innovation Council:**

Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), an initiative by the Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Government of India, to foster innovation and entrepreneurship among students and faculty in higher education institutions was formed in the College this year. The council conducted various sessions, workshops, competitions, certificate courses, etc. on innovations, start-ups, and motivation sessions.

**Certificate Courses:** The College successfully organised 14 add-on skill based certificate courses during the year. A total of 991 students successfully completed these certificate programmes. 238 of the 991 students joined for two and three courses and largely benefited.

**External Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) for the year 2021-22**: Triple A audit was conducted for the year 2021-22 by inviting Principal Venkitaramani, the former Registrar of University of Mumbai as the Chairperson and Professor Moushami Datta, the Principal of Nagindas Kandwala College, Malad as a member. They appreciated the style of working of the College and gave valuable suggestions for further improvement.

**Participation in NIRF Rankings 2023**: The College registered for India Rankings 2023 through the NIRF portal and participated in the same.

**Mentoring:** The College strengthened the mentoring of students by the faculties by classifying the students according to their needs grouping students into small numbers with group leaders and allotting manageable sizes of students to each teacher. Regular interaction with the group leaders and students by the teacher throughout the year was a great help for every student in their journey of acquiring knowledge, skills, and values. Keeping records of mentoring and regular reporting helped a lot in strengthening the mentoring.

### **Career Counselling and Placement Cell activities:**

The College Career Counselling and Placement Cell has conducted many webinars training programs, and guidance sessions for students to prepare for various job opportunities and for selecting and taking admissions in professional programs in the country and abroad. A large number of students actively participated in all these events and immensely benefited.

#### **Cultural Committee Activities:**

Cultural events and celebrations play an essential role in fostering a vibrant and inclusive campus environment. They provide opportunities for students, faculty, staff, and the wider community to come together, celebrate diversity, and showcase various cultural traditions. The College organized a two-day Inter-Collegiate Cultural and Sports mega festival 'Oasis' on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of January 2023. The two-day festival consisted of 24 Cultural events and 8 sports events such as Dance, Beatboxing Rapping, Fashion show, Street play, Fun games, Debate, Lips Don't Lie, Singing,



Blank typing, Box cricket, kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Volleyball Basketball, Chess, Carom and many more. 2,692 students from 92 colleges participated in the competitions. The excitement was at its peak.

A few of the other activities organized during the year were 'Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav', Garba Day, Freshers', Day, various Days of importance, Intra-Collegiate Fest, College Annual Day and Prize Distribution, etc. All these activities were well organized and accepted by the students.

### **Sports Activities:**

The Sports department of the College is very active and has given practice, facilities, and training to a large number of sports-loving students throughout the year. The department is headed by a qualified person with the assistance of one staff and many students. Besides the daily practice opportunities, the department conducted numerous sports competitions and organized the Annual Sports Meet on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2023. The majority of the students of the College participated in the Annual Sports Meet and made the event a memorable one for everyone. The department also conducted 8 sports events in intra-collegiate cultural and sports competitions 'Oasis' with more than 1,500 students participating from more than 90 colleges with a huge success. The department also organized the University of Mumbai Zonal sports competitions at our College, which was appreciated by the participants and the sports department of the University. The College motivated our students to participate in the sports competitions organized by other Colleges and the University and won prizes and appreciation.

### **Women Development Cell:**

The Women Development Cell of the College has conducted many inter and intra-collegiate events and workshops to promote the welfare and development of female students and address issues related to gender equality, women's rights, and safety. The Cell conducted awareness workshops, counselling sessions, sessions on legal awareness, etc. It also collaborated with NGO Akshara and organized Y-Talks (youth talks) having workshops, games, fun events, and live concerts. More than one thousand students from different colleges affiliated with Mumbai University participated in the event attended by an International influencer Masoom Minawala and made it a very successful mega event.

### **Parent Teacher Meetings:**

Class teachers and coordinators of all programmes conducted many parent-teacher meetings to brief the parents about the progress of their wards and to seek their active involvement in shaping the future of their wards.

#### **Students Council:**

College Students Council was formed on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2022, after the first year of undergraduate programme admissions. The Council consists of academic toppers of all the classes of each programmes and activity merit students of sports, cultural, and NSS nominated by the respective committee in charge. The election for the General Secretary of the council was conducted on 19<sup>th</sup> September. Mr. Aditya Ingle, TY BAF was elected as the General Secretary of the Council.





The members of the Council actively participated in organizing all College events and made the events successful.

#### **International Conference:**

International Conference on "Path towards Multi-Trillion Economy with Reference to India" was organized by the College on 28<sup>th</sup> January 2023 in association with the Commerce Department of University of Mumbai. Professor R. Nagarajan, IIPS was the Chief Guest, Dr. Narentharan Kaliappan from the University of Utara, Malaysia was the keynote speaker. Professor Sangita Pawar, HoD, Department of Commerce gave the introductory address of the conference. A total of 22 research papers were presented at the conference in two technical sessions. All these papers were selected for publication in UGC Care journals.

### **Library Committee activities:**

The Library Committee of the College organized many events during the year. Reading Day, National Librarian's Day, Book Exhibitions, Essay writing competitions, etc. are a few of the events organized by the committee.

**Industry Collaborations and Partnerships:** The College's collaborations and partnerships with industry organizations have been acknowledged through appreciation. These partnerships demonstrate the College's efforts in bridging the gap between academia and industry, fostering experiential learning opportunities, and providing students with practical exposure to real-world scenarios.





Commencement of Academic Year and Welcoming New Students: The Academic year commenced from 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 according to the Government Circular. College reopened with physical classes for SYJC. It was a jubilant moment for all, as after a gap of two years students




- 5. Festival of colours was arranged on the eve of Navrathri from 26th September till 4th October Students also participated in Garba Competition organized on 3rd October.


### PATRIARCHY IS A PILLAR OF SOCIAL INEQUALITY

#### INTRODUCTION

Social inequality is the condition when the resources available in the society are not equally distributed among various sections in the society or when certain sects are excluded from enjoying the resources available to all. Social inequality is a universal phenomenon. People across the world irrespective of caste, creed, religion, gender, education, income etc face social inequality in one circumstance or another. There are different means or types of social inequality ranging from wealth inequality, political inequality, life inequality etc. Maintaining social equality is a challenge which governments across the world face. The major examples of social inequality include income gap, gender inequality, health care, access to education, patriarchy etc. Class, race, and gender are forms of stratification that brings inequality and determine the difference in allocation of societal rewards. Gender as a social inequality is whereby women and men are treated differently due to masculinity and femininity by dividing labor, assigning roles, and responsibilities and allocating social rewards. Women never feel empowered in such a society.

One of the root causes of inequality in India is the patriarchal setup of the society. A patriarchal system is a society in which men control all aspects: from politics to morals to economics and even the actions of women. For centuries, the patriarchy has determined what is right from what is wrong, what can be done and what can't be done, where women go, how they act, and how much control they can have which is literally ignorable in a patriarchal society. Men, in this type of society, are the ultimate authority and power. Patriarchy finds it roots in the core principles of male dominance, centrism, and control. These values are rooted deeply and firmly within almost all the societies in the world.

Patriarchy is considered to be a very important element of social inequality. It creates an atmosphere of discrimination and oppression among the women which leads to reduced motivation, stress, frustration etc amongst the women community. Patriarchy is also considered as a weapon by male to prove their superiority over females. The men consider themselves more





powerful and privileged due to this evil social condition which is existing in countries around the globe. Oppression to woman is an interrelated historical fact. Woman is always dominated by man. Of course, times are changing and visible differences are now seen regarding how women are treated now as compared to earlier decades. There is a sign of positive change in this regard.

In one of the article by a women thinker Sylvia Walby, she had mentioned about two types or two distinct forms of patriarchy existing in the society which are as follows:-

- b. Public patriarchy which is operating in the outside of the home, that is in public.

According to her, women have tried to overcome private patriarchy to a great extent but public patriarchy is still in force to a great extent. She also opines that women have struggled to change both their immediate circumstances and the wider social structures. Females keep challenging these norms of the structures, yet there is a long way to go.

#### DISCUSSION

Patriarchy is a 'system of social structures and practices in which men dominate, oppress, and exploit women'. All human societies have a tendency to gain power amongst those who are the strongest, which manifests itself in numerous subconscious and invisible ways. Patriarchy is no exception: most institutions naturally give privilege to males over females. It divides society into men and women, insisting that men are more powerful, smarter, and better at almost everything than women are, therefore they should be in charge.

In a patriarchal social system, men are the highest authority and are unable to be questioned or directed by women. There are four main characteristics of patriarchy: male dominance, male identification, male-centeredness, and obsession with control which are explained briefly as follows:-

#### Male Dominance in Patriarchy

Male domination is an important aspect of patriarchal culture and is perhaps the number one reason for patriarchy in any sort of society: men always see themselves as better, stronger, and smarter than women. They see women are playthings who cannot possibly contribute in more ways than just doing the dishes and bearing their children. Male domination in a patriarchal society refers to the fact that men make all the decisions in both their family unit and society itself. They hold every position of power and authority possible. They are considered superior in all ways wherein women are hardly having any voice to raise their opinions.



#### Male Identification in Patriarchy

Male identification in a patriarchal society refers to the fact that men become concerned with identifying with qualities such as control, strength, and competitiveness. The men in a society such as this become obsessed with being forceful, rational, and having a strong work ethic. Male identification is necessary to patriarchy because, without it, men would likely allow their true personalities to show and allow women to participate.

#### Male Centeredness in Patriarchy

Male-centeredness in a patriarchal society refers to the fact that all activities and progression are due to men and what they can do to move society forward. Men become the developers and focusers of all inventions and events. Men become heroes in all situations. Men are the center of all fun, social engagements, and entertainment. They feel that women have no role or cannot contribute in any ways to the development of the society or economy.


#### Control of Family Situations

The last aspect of a patriarchal system is men's obsession with control. Men who live in a patriarchal society think they must be in control at all times. They desire to control all family and social situations. Similarly, they must make all decisions in regard to education and finances. They take it a step farther when they begin oppressing women for attempting to gain even the slightest amount of control. In a patriarchal society, women cannot obtain leadership roles, make decisions, show independence, or suggest change without permission from a man.

#### The Six Structures of Patriarchy

According to Walby, patriarchy operates in a more complex manner through six unique structures:

- 1) Production relations in the household- In the home, a woman must work for free under the expectations of her husband
- 2) Paid work- In the working world, women suffer from discriminatory pay, unfair treatment, and often find themselves in less demanding roles than their male counterparts.
- 3) The patriarchal state States can be inherently oppressive to women through policies and laws. Society is fundamentally biased toward the man. The role of women in politics is also negligible as compared to men.





- 4) Male violence This is not random or individual as it might appear. Instead, it operates under patterned and systemic criteria. Violence towards women is prohibited under law but the sad state is that many times the law is not followed.
- 5) Patriarchal relations in sexuality Different rules apply to both genders in social norms and expectations regarding sexual behavior.
- 6) Patriarchal cultural institutions- Many facets of society, namely media, religion, and education, produce and perpetuate portrayals of women through a patriarchal viewpoint. These viewpoints then contribute to women's own understanding of femininity. Many times women are portrayed as sex symbols.

#### PATRIARCHY IN INDIA

The system of patriarchy is commonly followed throughout the states in our country as well. In Indian society, in particular, the patriarchal norms and values are also a result of caste and religious inequalities that haunts the society. All these go hand in hand because that's what is being heard off since generations and generations. In Indian society, there is a notion that males are breadwinners and women are homemakers, which itself is a result of the patriarchal norms. This norm is then passed on to generations which make the upcoming generations also to believe in the same way. Thanks to education, we can see better changes in these areas now which are quite motivating and welcoming.

Examples of Patriarchy in day to day life.

- Using the surnames of father or husband.
- Mandatory household duties by women.
- Pay gap in gender wherein women get less paid than men. It was quite a motivating news
  when the BCCI announced that they are going to pay women cricket players at par with
  men.
- Moral policing
- Failure to discuss about women achievements
- Property Inherence and title related matters etc.

#### Cultures which follow the matrilineal system in India

When we talk about patriarchy, we should mention few cultures which do not support this system and follows matrilineal system which means of or based on kinship with the mother or the female line. Matrilineality is the tracing of kinship through the female line. It may also correlate with a social system in which each person is identified with their matriline – their mother's lineage – and



which can involve the inheritance of property and/or titles.

In several states of our country, the inhabitants follow this matrilineal system where the females are more powerful. In India, states such as Meghalaya, Assam, Kerala and Karnataka stood witness to various tribes as they came to practice matrilineality in their families. Some of the most significant tribes are Khasi, Gora, Nair and Izhava. Though matrilineal families, in Kerala and Karnataka, are urbanized and are being shifted gradually to patriarchal controls, the north-east still vehemently refuses to give up its age-old. There are also certain Muslims communities particularly to mention in the Malabar side, the Moplahs (or Mappilas) who even now follow the matrilineal system.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Patriarchy is a social evil which divides and discriminates between men and women. And by using this old age system, men resorts to various types of violence against women many of which are simply hidden within the four walls of their home. Today there is no area, field or sphere where women is lacking behind. We can see their enhanced presence starting from needles to airplanes. They have come miles ahead thanks to change in the social system especially with respect to providing education. Many steps are taken by ruling governments to make a difference in the lives of women and make them empowered but we have miles to go before we rest. The presence of women though seen but is still negligible in several areas especially the political system of country. system which emerged centuries ago owing to the conditions which was prevailing during those periods. But now it is wrong to still continue to hold up this evil system in the society. It is not about supporting feminism and upholding that women is more powerful than men. According to my personal opinion, men and women needs to be considered equally with none dominating the other. Equality between men and women exists when both sexes are able to share equally in the distribution of power and influence and have equal opportunities for financial independence through work or through any other decent form, enjoying equal access to education and the opportunity to develop personal ambitions, interests and talents, sharing responsibility for the home and children and are completely free from coercion, intimidation and any kind of gender-based violence both at work and at home. The coming generations are welcoming such approaches and this will definitely put an end to this social inequality pf prevailing patriarchy.





### 2) Embrace Global Education On Your Fingertips:



## Report of State Level Workshop on "How to Prepare Research Proposals for getting Sponsorship from various Government and Non-Government Agencies?"

She answered all the queries raised by the faculties. Total 78 participants attended the workshop.

## A Report on 4<sup>th</sup> International Conference on "Path towards Multi Trillion Economy with Reference to India"

David Cameron says "The economy is the start and end of everything. You can't have successful education reform or any other reform if you don't have a strong economy." The quote states importance of a strong economy. If we relate this to India we can understand the success that India had achieved so far to become a strong economy. It is also essential to understand India's journeytowards a multi trillion economy in a near future.

Keeping the goal of understanding various facets of India's journey towards a multi trillion economy, IQAC and Research Cell in association with Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai organized a 4<sup>th</sup> International Conference on "Path towards Multi Trillion Economy with Reference to India" on 28<sup>th</sup> January, 2023.

The conference was graced by the esteemed presence of Shri. O.K. Prasad, General Secretary, Sree Narayana Mandir Samiti and Shri. V.V. Chandran, Treasurer, Sree Narayana Mandir Samiti, Dr Sangita Pawar, HoD, Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai. Dr. R. Nagarajan, Professor, IIPS and



Dr. Narentharan Kaliappan, University Utara Malaysia. Dr. R. Nagarajan was the chief guest and Dr. Narentharan Kaliappanwas the key note speaker of the conference.

The conference was started with general introduction by Mr. Priydarshan Shede, which was followed by lighting of the lamp by the chief guest, guest of honor and other dignitaries. It was followed by a welcome address by Principal Dr. Ravindran Karthadi. He introduced the college to the dignitaries and to the participants. He mentioned that the college has been serving the underprivileged strata of the society since 1986 by providing quality education. He further updated that the College run 12 undergraduate and 4 postgraduate programs. He also gave a brief introduction to Sree Naryana Guru and his contribution to make a better society.

It was followed by presidential address by Shri. O.K. Prasad, General Secretary, SNMS. He highlighted that human resources are the roots of India's growth. He added further that the growth depends upon how do we performance our role. He gave a quick review of how India has been growing. He then spoke about Sree Naryana Mandir Samiti and its contribution towards a better life and a better society. He said that Sree Naryana Mandir Samiti was established in 1963 and since then it has been following the path laid by Sree Naryana Guru. He further mentioned that the aim of SNMS is to uplift and develop the society.

Prof. Jaysree V. introduced the chief guest Dr. R. Nagarajan and Principal felicitated him. She then introduced and felicitated. Dr. Sangita Pawar. She also introduced Sri O.K. Prasad sir who was felicitated by Dr. Hinduja .Then she introduced Sri. V. V.Chandran Sir and he was felicitated by Dr. Sumi Nijith.

Dr. Sangita Pawar explained the concept note of the conference. She started her speech by giving a tribute to Sree Narayana Guru. She appreciated the college by saying that SNGC was the first college to organize international conference in a hybrid mode. She discussed various facets of India's growth. She said that economy starts with the mass and ends with the mass thus there is a need of inclusive growth. She further added that the growth would take place with a welfare approach through sectorial distribution of the economy. She also highlighted the sectors where the growth had not been taken place so far. She stressed that the youth would contribute a lot to dividend line. Thus youth sensitization would take place through vocal platforms.

Dr. R. Nagarajan, chief guest of the conference, started his speech by appreciating the theme selected for the conference. He also spoke about Sree Naryana Guru and his contribution. He mentioned that Sree Naryana Guru's contribution was great to create an equitable society. He continued his session by asking a question if India is really 5<sup>th</sup> richest country. He highlighted the need of equitable distribution of income. He said that it would not be called a growth if the income would concentrate in the hands of a few. He mentioned further that equitable distribution of the income could be called as a growth. Sir referred that India was listed under lower middle income category in the list which was prepared on the basis of levels of income. Thus he asked a question if India is really a trillion economy. He further discussed population and its connection to growth. He said that we would not blame population as a hindrance in growth and development. He added that life expectancy had been increased since the independence of India. He highlighted further the negative elements that drag us back from growth and development. He said that 4% of girls were not allowed to be born. So he asked what the money does for gender equality. He mentioned the need of investment in health and education to achieve total growth and development of humanity through economy.





Dr. Sumi Nijith introduced the key note speaker Dr. Narentharan Kaliappan, University Uttar Malaysia. Dr. Narentharan spoke on "Enhancing Bilateral Ties between Malaysia and India". In the beginning of his session he gave a brief review of India's journey towards multi trillion economy. He referred Center for Economics and Business Research's estimation that India would become a \$10 trillion economy by 2035. He mentioned that building bilateral ties between India and Malaysia could enhance the competitiveness and expand the market and economy. He discussed 65 years old ties between India and Malaysia. He also spoke about India Malaysia Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (MICECA). He added that MICECA resulted into increase in India's imports from Malaysia by\$5.9 Bn. and exports by \$3.12 Bn. He further discussed Bilateral Trade Agreement and its output. He briefed about Malaysian companies in India and Indian companies in Malaysia. He further spoke about higher education cooperation between Malaysia and India. He mentioned that approx. 3000 Malaysian students are currently studying in India while about 1500 Indian students are studying in Malaysia.

The inaugural session came to an end with vote of thanks by Dr Hinduja, IQAC Coordinator, SNGC.

The 4<sup>th</sup> International Conference on "Path towards Multi-Trillion Economy with Special Reference to India" continued Post lunch with its Technical Sessions. The Technical sessions were divided into two slots. The first technical session saw 14 presentations in all.

The first Technical Session was chaired by Dr.Sujata.S.Khadilkar, Professor and Head, Department of Economics, S.K Somaiya College of Arts, Science and Commerce.

The highlights of papers presented in the first session:

Mrs.Nilima Suhas Jadhav, MIT-ADT University, and Dr. Milind Dhobley, LoniKalbhorRachanaSansad College of Applied Art and Craft, presented a paper on the topic, "The Media is the New Creative- Issues and Challenges faced by Self Help Groups (SHGs) with reference to COVID-19 lockdown" where an insight related to the problems faced by the SHGs during the pandemic was highlighted.




The second Technical session was chaired by Dr. Sangeeta Pawar madam, HOD, Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai.

#### 3. Sell a Product:



#### Essay on Sree Narayana Guru

Sree Narayana Guru, also known as Narayana Guru Swami, was a prominent spiritual leader and social reformer from Kerala, India. Born in 1856 in Chempazhanthy, a village near Thiruvananthapuram, he dedicated his life to the upliftment of the oppressed and marginalized sections of society, and advocated for social equality and education for all.

Narayana Guru was born into a family of farmers, and was educated in the traditional Vedic system. However, he was dissatisfied with the rigid caste system and inequality prevalent in Indian society at the time.

He began to question the established religious and social norms, and sought to find a more inclusive and egalitarian path.

Through his teachings and actions, Narayana Guru sought to break down the barriers of caste and religion, and promote a message of universal brotherhood and compassion. He emphasized the importance of education, and established several schools and educational institutions for the upliftment of the underprivileged. 


