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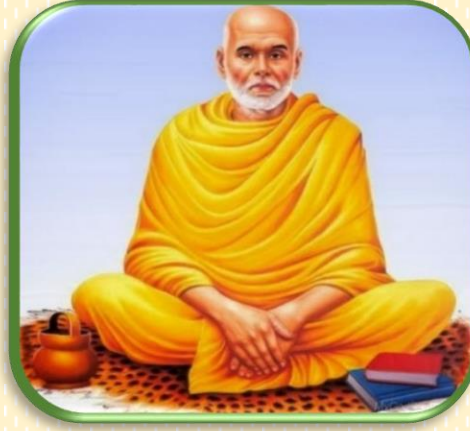
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Sree Narayana Guru (1854-1928)

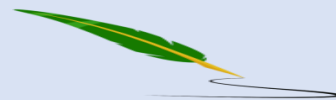

The academic year 2020-2021 presented unprecedented challenges due to the global Covid-19 pandemic. Some of the notable challenges faced during this period include:

Transition to Online Learning: With the closure of educational institutions to prevent the spread of the virus, students and educators had to quickly adapt to online learning platforms. This transition posed challenges related to technology access, internet connectivity, and adapting teaching methods to suit the online environment. Our college was one of the few colleges started the online academic sessions even before the University issued guidelines.

Disruption of Academic Calendar: The pandemic led to the disruption of the traditional academic calendar, with delays in exams, admissions, and the start of new academic sessions. Uncertainty surrounding the duration of closures and the mode of education added further challenges to academic planning.

Student Well-being: The sudden shift to online learning, social isolation, and uncertainties about the future took a toll on students' mental health and well-being. Colleges had to find ways to support students emotionally and provide resources for mental health counseling and support services.

Financial Strain: The economic impact of the pandemic affected many students and their families, leading to financial strain. Some students faced difficulties paying College fees, accessing learning materials, or affording basic necessities, creating barriers to their education. The College extended helping hands to the students to the extent it was possible.

Assessment and Evaluation: Conducting assessments and evaluating student performance in the online mode posed challenges, including ensuring the integrity of online exams, preventing cheating, and assessing practical skills or group projects remotely.

Overall, the academic year 2020-2021 presented multifaceted challenges for educational institutions, students, and educators alike, requiring resilience, adaptability, and innovative solutions to navigate the unprecedented circumstances posed by the Covid-19 pandemic.

Activities enriching NAAC Criteria:

In the academic year, the College diligently conducted numerous activities aimed at enhancing awareness and skills among students and staff, aligning with the Quantitative Metrics of NAAC, particularly focusing on Criteria 1,2,3,5, and 7.

Throughout the year, a total of 12 activities were organized, benefiting a significant number of students and teachers. A comprehensive report detailing these activities has been included in this annual publication. Moreover, many faculty members actively participated in webinars and training sessions sponsored by MHRD and other organized by Universities and NAAC. These sessions served as invaluable opportunities for professional development and enrichment.

The College also played a pivotal role in arranging financial assistance and scholarships for students from various sources, greatly benefiting a large number of students and contributing their educational journey.

Additionally, several certificate courses were organized for students, further enhancing their skills and qualifications. A detailed report on these certificate courses can be found separately in this publication. These concerted efforts underscore our commitment to providing holistic education and fostering the growth and development of both students and staff members at our institution.

Research Committee Report:

An international level Web Conference on “Digital Transformation: Issues and Challenges” was organized on 17th April, 2021. Professor Raina Lampou from Greece was the Key-note speaker. Dr. Narentharen Kaliyappan (Malaysia), Dr. Marirajan Thiruppathi (Ethiopia) were other resource persons. Total 27 research papers were selected for presentation and published in International Journal for Innovative Research in Multidisciplinary Field (ISSN: 2455 - 0620), Research Culture Society and Publication.

The webinar and conference organized by the Research Committee served as valuable platforms for knowledge dissemination and scholarly exchange, receiving positive feedback from participants and contributing to the academic enrichment of the community.

Computer Labs Inventory for Students and Faculty:

The College is committed to meeting the technological needs of its students and faculty by providing well-equipped computer labs across various sections of the campus. These computer labs are integral to the academic environment, serving as vital resources for conducting practical sessions, research, and other academic activities. They ensure that both students and faculty have access to modern computing facilities, enhancing their learning and teaching experiences.

College Library:

Over the years the College Library has evolved into a comprehensive resource centre catering to the diverse academic needs of its users. Equipped with a wide array of resources, the library boasts an extensive collection of reference and textbooks, CD-ROM s, and access to a subscribed N-LIST portal, facilitating seamless access to e-books and e-journals. Recognizing the evolving requirements of its users, the library annually procures new text and reference books to align with the changing academic landscape and meet the specific needs of its patrons.

In addition to its extensive print and electronic collection, the library also provides access to various newspapers, magazines, and journals, further enriching the academic experience of its users and keeping them abreast of current affairs and scholarly developments.

To facilitate digital learning and research, the library is equipped with 28 state-of-art computers equipped with LAN and internet connectivity. This infrastructure caters to the needs of both students and teachers, providing them with the necessary tools and resources to engage in effective research and learning activities.

Overall, the library at Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce stands as a vital hub of knowledge and learning, continuously evolving to meet the dynamic needs of its academic community and fostering a culture of intellectual growth and exploration.

The College has an incubation centre inside the library with 26 latest model computers with LAN and internet connectivity for students and teachers project and research work.

Additionally, regular communication channels were established to address any concerns of queries from students regarding the online examination procedures.

By embracing online examination methodologies, the College demonstrated its commitment to continuity in education and academic excellence amidst challenging circumstances. The successful implementation of online examinations underscored the College's ability and resilience in navigating unprecedented situations while prioritizing the academic progress of its students.

Sports & Games:

The sports Committee, under the leadership of Ms. Poonam Mujawar, organized several impactful activities throughout the academic year 2020-21. Witnessed by over 3400 attendees via YouTube live streaming, the event served as a powerful tribute to the nation's freedom and unity.

Injecting doses of laughter and literary flair, a Mid-Week Blasters event unfolded on September 10th, 2020. Featuring an online Poet conference and stand-up comedy, the event saw the participation of 14 individuals, each receiving e-certificates for their contributions.

Navratri was celebrated in style on October 17th, 2020, with a Click a picture competition, highlighting the festive spirit and vibrant traditions. Sanskriti, Intra-collegiate fest on December 1st, 2020, witnessed a remarkable turnout, with over 400 participants engaging in 20 diverse events. The subsequent awarding of cash prized on January 26, 2021 added a touch of prestige to the winners' accomplishments.

Republic Day was commemorated with zeal and patriotism on January 26th, 2021, through a virtual celebration attended by over 3700 individuals via YouTube live streaming.

Concluding the academic year on a high note, the Inter-Collegiate Fest Oasis-2021 unfolded on February 22 and 23, 2021. Drawing 477 students from 19 colleges of Mumbai University, the event showcased talent across 16 captivating events, with cash prized and certificates serving as tokens of recognition.

Indeed, the Cultural Committee's unwavering commitment to fostering creativity, cultural exchange, and community engagement has left an indelible mark on the academic landscape, enriching the lives of students and faculty alike.

Industrial Visit Committee Activities:

In the academic year 2020-2021, the Industrial Visit Committee, led by Miss. Rishita Shukla, innovatively adapted to the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic by transitioning the traditional industrial visit to an online industrial training format.

On March 22nd, 2021, the Committee organized an Online Industrial Training in collaboration with Rubicon, generously funded by Barclays Bank. The session was facilitated by Mr. Prince Grover, a seasoned professional with extensive industry experience.

The training session proved to be highly interactive and informative, covering essential topics such as work ethics, the importance of professional behavior, strategies for handling stressful interviews, and navigating tricky interview questions. Participants gained valuable insights into work etiquette and professional conduct. A total of 340 students benefited from the session, with each participant receiving an E-certificate to acknowledge their participation and completion of the online industrial training. Despite the limitations posed by the pandemic, the Industrial Visit Committee successfully provided students with a valuable learning experience, contributing to their professional development and preparation for future endeavors.

NSS Activities:

The National Service Scheme (NSS) for the academic year 2020-2021, led by Mr. Mohammed Jabir and Ms. Priyanka Suryawanshi, along with other members, focused on fostering civic responsibility and social consciousness among students. The NSS activities spanned a wide range of initiatives aimed at addressing societal issues and promoting community welfare.

Key Highlights:

The NSS consisted of 150 student volunteers, organized into 2nits, with 56 male and 94 female participants. Through their diverse array of activities and initiatives, the NSS contributed significantly to fostering a sense of social responsibility and collective action among students, empowering them to become active agents of positive change within society.

The Women Development Cell activities:

Throughout the year 2020-21, the Women Development Cell, under the guidance of Ms. Mamtra Meghnani, organized two impactful events. These events aimed to address pertinent issues related to gender equality, violence against women, and fostering conversations around women's rights.

The first activity, "Unpacking gender - the lockdown & violence on Women," held on 10th July, 2020, witnessed participation from 184 individuals. The event provided a platform to discuss the challenges faced by women during the lockdown period, shedding light on issues of violence and discrimination. The second event, "Conversation on equality," conducted on 8th March, 2021, engaged 78 participants in meaningful discussions concerning gender equality. This event aimed to raise awareness and promote dialogue on the importance of equality in all spheres of life.

Through these initiatives, the Women Development Cell demonstrated its commitment to advocating for gender equality, empowering women, and fostering a supportive environment for addressing gender-related issues within the academic community.

Extension Activities:

There was active participation in the Department of Life Long Learning & Extension of the University of Mumbai. Our 228 students enrolled in the program. They engaged in various University-organized events and conducted several events at the College level.

Alumni Association:

On August 30, 2020, the Sree Narayana Guru College Alumni Association, in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of Navi Mumbai Industrial Area and Student Leaders Network, Pune, organized a webinar titled “Networking for Impact” on the Zoom platform. The webinar addressed several sub-themes, including strategically managing networks, leveraging social media for personal and professional growth, and the principles of collaboration for collective impact. A total of 132 participants received e-certificates for their participation.

The Alumni Committee created a Google form to collect current data from alumni, receiving 110 alumni records to establish a comprehensive database.

On February 6, 2021, the Sree Narayana Guru College Alumni Association conducted a workshop cum expert talk on awareness about sustainable menstruation. Mrs. Seema K from Asha social group served as the resource person, guiding 40 female participants on the preparation of their own cotton pads.

In collaboration with the NSS cell of the College, the Alumni Association organized an offline session on “Behavioral change to drive social impact through entrepreneurship & innovation for sustainable development” on February 22, 2021. Ms. Neha Shaw, Director & CEO, Co-founder, Dame & Earl LLP, YSI, served as the expert for the session, which was attended by 52 NSS volunteers.

College Extension Work Committee:

The College conducted a National level online quiz competition on Health, Hygiene & Nutrition, featuring 25 questions worth 4 marks each. Certificates were awarded to participants scoring more than 50%. A total of 331 participants took part in the quiz competition, showcasing the engagement and reach of the College’s extension activities.

It's the 'depression' which hampers the personality and productivity of an individual. The word depression has been doing its rounds more frequently during these days as compared to earlier times. People are slowly recognizing the importance of this term and are being ready to open up about this in the public and are also welcoming discussions on this term.

DEPRESSION

Depression is a group of conditions associated with the elevation or lowering of a person's mood. It is basically a mood disorder that can affect a person's daily life. It may be described as feelings of sadness, loss, or anger. Approximately 1 in 15 adults are affected by depression in any given year; according to the American Psychiatric Association (APA). Depression is a common yet serious mental health condition that has a negative impact on how an individual feel, think, and act. People of all age groups may face this situation. Even children are nowadays prone to this condition which may require immediate medical support. People experience depression in different ways. It may interfere with your daily work, resulting in lost time and lower productivity. It can also influence relationships and also result in some chronic health conditions like cardiovascular diseases, diabetes, obesity etc.

'Depression has no face. Be kind to even smiling faces'. I came across these words recently in a social media platform which aptly explains how everyone tries to hide their inner problems and

worries and bring a smile to their face. Today's stressful environment plays a major role in making someone moody, tensed, frustrated, tired and lacking confidence. This pandemic has in fact worsened the condition. The medical support system throughout the world has opened help lines and toll free numbers to guide people to overcome this tensed state of mind during this pandemic.

There are several causes of depression which could be originating from various reasons like: -

1. Family history, Early childhood problems
2. Structure of the brain, Medical conditions, drug usage
3. Stressful situations like economic problems, death of a loved one, work life imbalance etc.

In the current scenario, the pandemic, loss of employment opportunities, loss of loved ones, inability to travel and meet the dear and near ones etc has created a stressful situation. Among these a new normal which has emerged in the employment sphere- "Work from Home" has also contributed to depression. It may be viewed as an easy and flexible option to be continuing working from the home. With everything shifting to online mode, work from home has been accepted widely. Though some people are joining the physical workspace right now, famous companies like Facebook and Twitter are planning to allow WFH permanently because of the convenience that it offers to the employees. In fact, Govt. of India has allowed maximum work from home for IT and BPO employees. With flexible hours and zero traveling time, WFH is believed to have opened a wider range of opportunities for women, especially the ones who are mothers and are married, to continue working without deviating from their professional growth while taking care of other responsibilities. The government has issued guidelines regarding allowing employees to work from home in view of the current pandemic situation like by limiting the attendance of the employees and all. Initially it was a boon for the people. Especially when people took it like when many were losing their jobs, few were blessed to have a job in hand. People enjoyed the comfort and easiness at home, they did

not need to get up and rush to work, they stayed away from the crowds, traffic and pollution and most importantly they got quality time to spend with the family. But it brings along with it multitude of issues which hampers the mental health and productivity of an employee. People started facing social isolation which is an uncomfortable situation. Digital devices started processing all our information whereas earlier we could converse with others like our friends, colleagues, relatives physically which was literally difficult now. As a result, anxiety and tension added up creating personal stress. At the same time, this was worsening for women. For working women, it has become dual responsibilities to be managed at the same time. They need to manage the household chores along with attending meetings, completing the targets and all. It hampered the entire schedule of the women. When they were expecting some relief by moving out of their homes at least for few hours a day for some exposures, meeting colleagues, networking which is a very important thing, that main element is missing now. Apart from that, many organizations announced a pay cut adding to the existing problems. It also brings along with it issues like: -

1. No fixed schedules for working.
2. Always stay online and remain available.
3. Online harassment, inappropriate texts.
4. Lack of technological support.
5. Poor networking with colleagues and limited social contact.

These situations are all new in the workplace and it takes time for employees to adjust be it male or female. Meanwhile they may lose their interest in their jobs, which may result in lowered productivity. Poor ergonomics at home working space/ place also leads to physical problems like back pain, dryness in the eyes, neck pain, over weight etc. Amounting to these is the mounting pressure from the firm in meeting the deadlines which could be quite challenging. There could be a constant pressure to stay positive and remain productive in work. There are also the issues of

working everyday irrespective of the time and day, forget about the weekdays and weekends. Such kind of stressful situation may make person lonely and isolated. He/ she may long for the companionship which they are missing for a period or maybe longing to go back to their workplace cabins to get relief over there. They may find it difficult to share their problems with the family members and hence may keep it all amongst themselves which may result in a burnout and may also affect the personal relationships at home. They may need someone to listen to them. There are extreme situation when they may even show suicidal tendencies. All these are completely psychological in nature and in many times we never know what makes someone take extreme steps like that. Only open communication and productive conversations can help someone overcome such a difficult and painful situation. The companies should be able to identify such people who are showing lack of interest in their work, withdrawing from all activities, lack of concentration, resorting to alcohol and drugs etc. They should provide adequate breaks for the employees whenever required. The services of a psychologist or a counselor should be made available in the organization for the employees to open up to. It is the mutual responsibility of an employee as well as the employer to provide support at this negative stage faced by the employee.

CONCLUSION

The organizations must extend more empathy towards its workforce, and take steps to support and encourage them to maximize productivity while they achieve the best possible work-life balance. In an effort to stay connected and build a positive working environment, at the outset of the pandemic and such difficult periods, efforts should be taken to take along the employees together instead of just ignoring them. They can promote several activities like online yoga & meditation, therapies, get gifts delivered to their homes, provide psychological help wherever required etc. A good listener can easily help in guiding such depressed employees to remain active and positive as earlier. The need of the hour is to continue to reinforce positivity along with spreading happiness

and manage the feelings of isolation, and uncertainty, by open communication with all the employees and meaningful engagement where in the HR department can play a major role. Almost everyone has experienced some level of discomfort or mental stress owing to this pandemic. But this stigma can be overcome only if people come forward and share their experiences. Depression is not to be hidden instead it is something which can be overcome with adequate and timely support.

The companies can come up with unique, proactive workplace mental health training for employees belonging to different levels. Such trainings can easily accommodate and prepare the employees to face or to navigate the uncertainty that may rise in the future also. They can come up with virtual informal meetings and plan happy hours. If employers don't provide awareness or educate employees on the importance of good mental health and create an environment where such issues are discussed openly and without any stigma, companies could end up seeing a higher turnover rate also in the near future.

Along with these issues, companies also have to focus on return-to work anxiety by preparing the employees to come back to the workplace. Recently a video went viral in social media where a young female employee was seen saying that she didn't want to stop Work from home even after the pandemic situation gets over. It's all about the individual viewpoint or perception. The role of every organization is to support their employees, their most valuable assets. As goes the well-known phrases, "The show must go on" and "This too will pass away", let's firmly believe that we will get strength and will power to overcome this situation and we become more generous and keep alive the spark of love and humanity in our lives to share and care for everything in the world.
