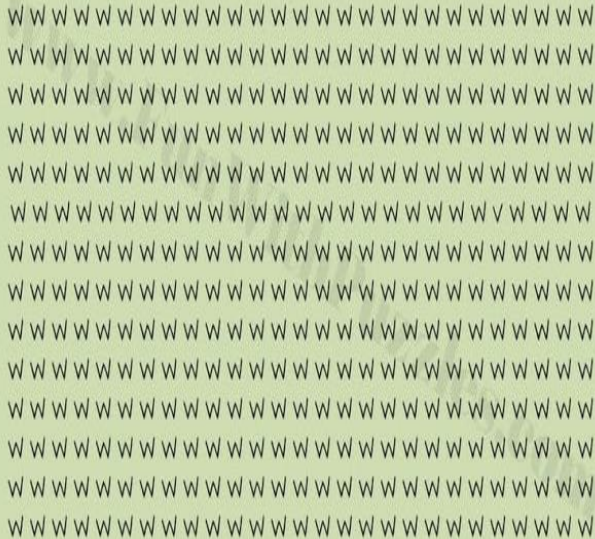

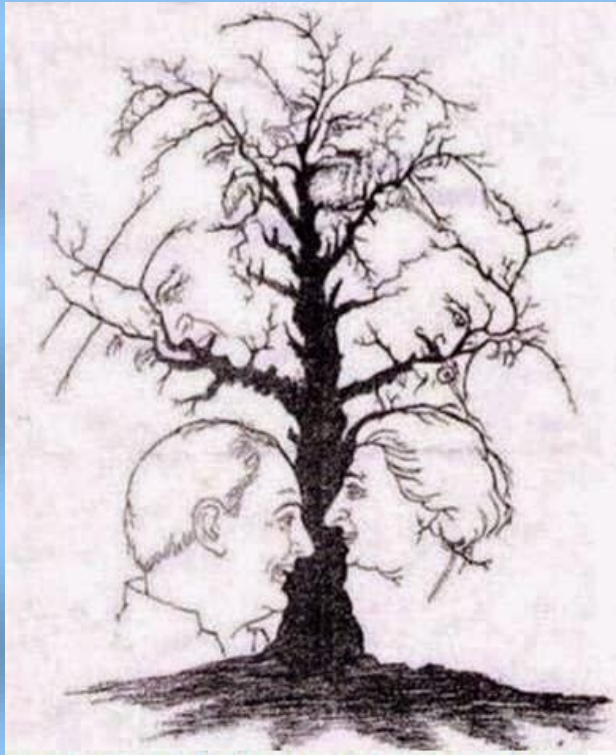

A peep into the life of Ruskin Bond

“When World War 2 broke out, my Dad, who was in the Air Force, went to war. He sent me to live with my maternal grandparents in Dehradun; I was 6. It was tough–I missed Dad terribly. A year later, Mum and Dad got divorced; then just before the end of the war, we got a letter saying that Dad had died of a bullet; I was shattered. I grew very lonely. A few years later, Mum remarried, but I couldn’t accept another man in Dad’s place–as a child, I resented my step-dad. So, I tried to create my own little world–after school, I’d curl up with a book and forget about everything else.

In a way, books were my escape–at the age of 12, I used to read more than 5 books a week. All I wanted was to emulate my favourite authors, so I started writing short stories.

And in 1951, my first story was published in a local magazine; I was 16! Thrilled, I told Mum, ‘I want to be a writer.’ But she didn’t take me seriously–I was shipped off to England for college.

The next 4 years taught me how difficult it was to sustain as a writer. After college, I’d juggle 4 part-time jobs and chores. At the end of the day, I’d be exhausted, still I’d write at night. On weekends, I’d go from one publishing house to another, but my work was rejected everywhere.

So, after college, I decided to move back to India. But just as I boarded the ship, I got a postcard saying that one of my stories was selected by a publisher; they’d sent me a cheque of £50!

In India, mum and my step-dad had moved to Delhi and my grandparents had passed. So, I rented a small apartment in Mussoorie and lived by myself. Every day,

I'd bombard newspapers—one published story used to earn me about Rs.50; I was content with that.

And in 1956, I wrote the Night Train at Deoli, which became a bestseller. I was 24 and wrote a lot about falling in love with girls at train stations. But in reality, none of those girls reciprocated. I mean, here I am, at 87, still a bachelor! So in the 1960s, I adopted my grandson— now he and his kids are my family.

But being a writer meant living hand to mouth, so I'd often go to Delhi and do odd jobs. And when I had enough money, I'd come up to the hills to write.

It was only in the 1990s that I realised I was popular. I was at a station when 3 kids pointed at me and exclaimed, 'Ruskin Bond, Ruskin Bond!' Relieved, I thought, 'At least someone knows me!'

In the past 30 years, my routine hasn't changed much—I enjoy my morning hikes, watch TV and munch on my favourite mutton cutlets while writing. With age, I've started enjoying my naps a lot more. On weekends, I go to the one bookstore here and talk to people.

And now, my godsons have put me on Instagram—they keep teaching me how to use it. But I've given up! I chuckle and tell them, 'I'm very happy with my books, don't make me a part of this online world.'”

**What is 5G?
Know more about it.**

What is 5G?.5G is the fifth generation of mobile broadband network which boasts about the possibility of high degree of speed up to 20Gbps data, negligible latency, more reliability with low costs and low resources consumption.5G promises to be high quality of service

option with higher availability for multiple kinds of services such as mobile broadband, mission critical systems and Internet of Things.

Why do we need 5G? Because present 4G LTE is reaching its limits of sustainability.4G can not keep up with the demands of future services or support newer techs that requires better data rate and higher efficiency. 5G is supposed to meet all these expectations.5G is supposed to offer speed up to 20Gbps but in actual commercial use 5G carrier broadband will give up to 1Gbps of speed which is still 10 times faster than 4GLTE.

What are benefits of 5G? If deployed with its full capabilities as predicated by the Telecom providers, It could be the better replacement option for home broadband, and not only that but also much more than that. If its deployed successfully, 5G will be able to provide better connectivity of all IoT devices given IoT system accommodate mobile broadband connection, It will be able to support Virtual reality and Augmented reality technologies because of its massive data rate and negligible latency and also because of 5G small cells which will make data processing easier and more close to user compared to Google or Amazons hyper scale data centers. Because of 5G's speed and connectivity among variety of devices we would potentially step into the new age of self-driving vehicles and automated systems, cloud computing, AR/VR, smart homes and cites and what not.

What is the future of 5G in India? Many countries around the world had already started implementing 5G since 2019. India had also planned to start 5G back in 2018. Reliance jio, Airtel and Vodafone had already prepared themselves for 5G. Airtel have already announced that its network is ready for 5G, while Jio announced that it will start its 5G services in the second half of this year. While jio is using stand alone, 5G architecture for trials and testing, Airtel too has started 5G testing in Gurugram. Its expected that 5G services will start from early 2022.

What would you need to access 5G? If one wants to use 5G network with the high speed as commercialized, will need a phone that supports 5G. There are mobile brands that have launched 5G phones in market. But that doesn't mean you won't be able to use 5G in a 4G phone, 5G will still work on top of 4G connection but it will not give user the high speed as top as 1Gbps. You may or may not need a new 5G sim card depending on the operator you are subscribed to. You'll need to be subscribed to a 5G plan offered by your service provider to access 5G network.

Myself **Ibne Ali** from Patna Bihar a 15-year-old teenager. I was completely unaware about what cancer is when I was kid I use to see it in cigarette packet written cancer and I had a thought that it is a dangerous disease. When I faced cancer at the age of 13, I had a feel that I am going to die but I got cured with many ups and downs at the age of 15.

Like other student my studies were going on and I was pursuing my 7th std, on 15th march 2015 night I had a vomiting and few hours later I had gone to washroom thrice and in the third time I was unconscious in bathroom and next day morning I was conscious my parents and my family members were worried about me. On next day my parents took me to the private hospital, since it was a holi festival most of the hospitals were closed and few hospitals which were running but doctors were on leave. My parents took me to P.M.C.H (Patna Medical Centre Hospital) a government hospital. I had been admitted there for 1 week and on 3rd day my blood samples had been took and within one day my report came and in that we came to know that I had a blood cancer B-ALL (B-Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia). The doctors over there refereed us to TATA memorial hospital Mumbai for further treatment. I and my parents reached Mumbai, I had been admitted at TATA hospital and in Mumbai we had no room to leave so we stayed at hospital for full one day than villager's colleagues helped us for shelter. Then I had started with check up of blood test and the report were normal and on next day my bone marrow test occurred and report were as same as in Patna, a blood cancer. The doctor Vasudev at TATA hospital called my parents and said about cancer I had and the duration period of the treatment. My treatment had been started with 4 chemotherapies of 6 months and 2 years of maintenance,

during my chemotherapy treatment I faced lot of common sideeffects and undergone full 2 years 6month treatment of cancer and in 3 years I was fully cured on 20th september 2017, but we had financial problems because of which my parents forced to sell their lands hearing this hurted me a lot, then finally I was cured. And during my treatment I had a talk with Sandeep Yadav who is a KCK member at CANKIDS he explains that they do awarness on cancer and also give financial help for cancer patient. So, I joined CANKIDS as a KCK member and after my treatment I started attending events of CANKIDS and doing awarness on cancer by running marathon etc. During my follow up at TATA memorial hospital Aameetha madam a social worker said about GIFT OF LIFE FOUNDATION Moscow Russia where, under 15 cancer survivors game occurs in which all over the world from 18 countries cancer survivor student participate in it. So, I tried for it and been selected for 5 games chase, running, football, swimming and riffle shooting hearing it my parents were so happy and were proud of me. I am also proud to represent our India. I have won many certificates in sports at school level and dream to win the same in my visit to Russia on 1st August 2018. I want to really thank Aameetha madam for giving this golden opportunity and to thank the entire person who is sponsoring my trip to Russia.

My dream is to become a film director the reason behind it I want to show to the world that how a cancer patient life is and what are the difficulties they face throught their life according to me media is the place where we can give the message to people easily. Through my life story I have learnt that however your life difficult may be seem, there is always something you can do and succeed at and I hope you do the same in your life. - Ibne Ali

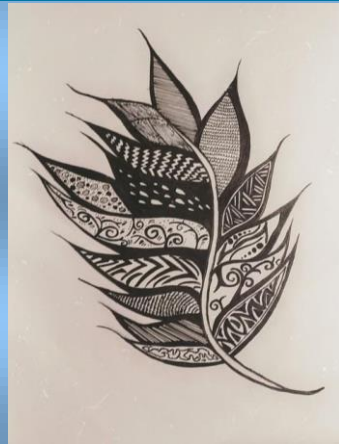

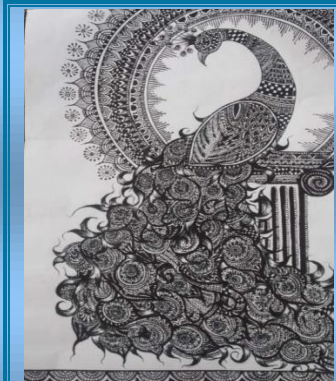

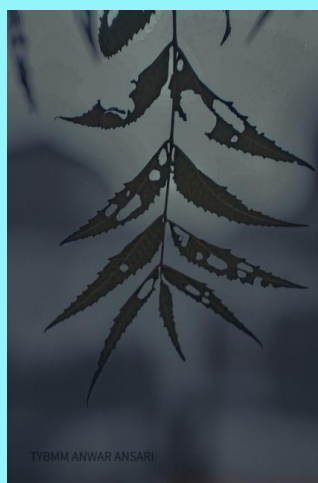
