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


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


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SREE NARAYANA GURU (1856-1928)



Sree Narayana Guru was a prominent social reformer, philosopher, and spiritual leader from Kerala, India. He was born on August 20, 1856, in Chempazhanthy, a village near Thiruvananthapuram, the capital city of Kerala. Sree Narayana Guru belonged to the Ezhava community, which was historically marginalized and faced discrimination in the caste-based social hierarchy prevalent in Kerala during that time. He strongly advocated for social equality, education, and the upliftment of oppressed communities. Sree Narayana Guru emphasized the importance of spiritual enlightenment and individual liberation, irrespective of caste, creed, or gender. He worked tirelessly to eradicate caste-based discrimination and untouchability. He established several temples, schools, and ashrams, which were open to people from all castes, including lower castes. These institutions played a significant role in promoting education, social harmony, and the empowerment of marginalized communities. His teachings emphasized self reform, self-reliance, and the importance of moral values. He sought to eradicate social evils such as caste discrimination, superstitions, and rituals that perpetuated inequality. His teachings and philosophy continue to have a profound impact on Kerala society and beyond. Sree Narayana Guru passed away on September 20, 1928, but his legacy lives on through his teachings, institutions, and the impact he made in the realm of social reform and spiritual enlightenment. He is revered as a social reformer, philosopher, and spiritual guide by millions of people in Kerala and beyond.

As we look ahead, we remain committed to our mission of empowering students to thrive in a dynamic world. We invite you to explore the pages that follow and celebrate our collective achievements as we continue to build a brighter future together.

During the academic year, the College witnessed a significant increase in the overall student enrolment. The total strength of students across all programs reached a record high of 3110 showing the growing popularity and reputation of our institution.

Final-year students' academic performance: Out of 498 students who appeared for final year undergraduate exams 450 passed giving a passing percentage of 90.36%. Out of the 781 first-year students, 652 students passed and were promoted to second-year classes giving 83.48% pass and promotion. In the second year out of 472 students, 406 students got passed and promoted to the third-year classes, which is 80.02%.

Participation in NIRF Rankings 2024: The College registered for India Rankings 2024 through the NIRF portal and participated in the same.

IQAC Report

IQAC conducted 30 events in the academic year 2023-24 .IQAC also conducted 15 certificate courses and 1655 students completed the certificate course in 2023-24.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) serves as a cornerstone for our college's commitment to quality enhancement and development. Throughout the academic year 2023-24, the IQAC has diligently organized a range of activities aimed at elevating the educational standards and overall experience at our institution. Here, we summarize the key initiatives undertaken during this period.

National Level Research Workshop

On July 28, 2023, the IQAC hosted a workshop titled "Preparing Effective Research Proposals & Funding Agencies for Sponsorship." This event was primarily targeted at faculty and postgraduate students, offering insights into the methodologies for crafting successful proposals for various funding bodies.



Session on Career Development

On August 19, 2023, a session called "Pathway to Success: Mastering Higher Education, Crafting Winning Resumes, Enhancing Soft Skills, and Excelling in Interviews" was organized for final-year students. The session began with a short film depicting the experiences of freshers entering the workforce. Participants received valuable information on postgraduate programs and tips for successfully navigating entrance exams.

Faculty Development Program on Research Methodology

From August 21 to 26, 2023, the IQAC, in collaboration with the Research Cell of Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce and Sree Narayana Guru College of Education, conducted a **state-level Faculty Development Program (FDP) on "Research Methodology."** This program aimed to equip faculty members with essential research skills and attracted 48 participants from various higher education institutions across Maharashtra.

Session on Personal Development

On September 9, 2023, the Department of B.B.I., in association with the IQAC, organized a session titled "Learning at Life School." Led by TISS alumna Dr. Aparna Sharma, an HR practitioner and independent director, this engaging session focused on building confidence and overcoming life challenges. The event also featured the launch of Dr. Sharma's book, "Between U & Me," and benefited 185 participants.

Field Visit to Bombay Stock Exchange

On December 5, 2023, **426 undergraduate students** participated in a field visit to the Bombay Stock Exchange. The IQAC facilitated this experience by arranging transportation for students who wished to travel with faculty, while also allowing others to make their own arrangements.

Workshop on HR Practices

On January 27, 2024, the Career Counselling Cell organized a workshop on "Recent Trends in HR Practices in the Corporate Sector." This workshop, featuring resource person Shri Tarun Varma, Global Chief of HR at Tata Consumer Products, benefited 196 students. Through these initiatives, the IQAC continues to play a vital role in enhancing the quality and effectiveness of our educational programs, contributing to the holistic development of our students and faculty alike.

Research Cell and international conferences.

The IQAC, Library, IT, and Data Science departments jointly organized the 5th International Conference on "Latest Digital Applications in Teaching and Library Management." on September 16, 2023, in the seminar hall. The event saw 44 registrations and received 37 research papers, which were subsequently published in the UGC CARE journal. The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Sarbani Banerjee Belur, Senior Research Scientist at IIT Bombay, and the technical session was chaired by Ms. Sonali Kanekar, Librarian of NK College.

Another International Conference titled "Multifaceted Collaborations: Bridging the Gap Between Industry and Academia" was conducted on December 20, 2023, in association with the Department of Commerce, University of Mumbai. The event featured Dr. D.K. Sharma as the Chief Guest, Ms. Soni Misra as the Guest of Honour, and Dr Madhuhree Sekhar as the keynote speaker. A total of 62 research papers were submitted from various states, along with one from Canada. These were presented by faculty and research scholars through both online and offline modes in two technical sessions. The conference provided valuable insights and proved beneficial for both students and faculty members.



NSS Activities:

"NSS provides a unique platform for young people to engage in community service and foster a sense of social responsibility. It is through such initiatives that we can truly make a difference in the lives of others." - Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam. Our NSS unit is a most vibrant and committed set of volunteers and Programme Officers for the upliftment of society.

The NSS unit, in collaboration with environmentalist Ms. Rashmi Joshi, organized a session on rainwater harvesting along with workshops on seed ball making and e-waste management on 5th and 6th July 2023.

On 17th July 2023, a road safety awareness program was conducted in partnership with United Way, where Mr. Sujit Patil served as the resource person. Students were educated on road safety rules and defensive driving. Additionally, 26 NSS volunteers participated in seed ball making, which were later used for seed bombing in Adai village. The volunteers walked 5 km from Panvel station to the village, conducted a cleanliness drive, and carried out the seed bombing with seeds collected from students. Tree plantation drives remain a key initiative of the NSS unit to promote environmental conservation.

On 16th September 2023, the NSS unit, in collaboration with Sion Hospital and the Lions Club of Millennium, organized a blood donation drive, collecting a record 91 units of blood—the highest ever in the history of the SNGC NSS unit.

After Diwali, NSS volunteers raised ₹24,000 for cancer patients and donated the amount to the Cancer Aid and Research Foundation.

Furthermore, 150 NSS volunteers **collected usable old clothes from the campus** and donated them to an NGO in Chembur for distribution to underprivileged and needy individuals.

NSS Residential Camp.

The NSS unit of SNGC organized a 7-day residential camp from December 18 to December 24, 2023, in **Done village, Vangani**. Throughout the camp, students participated in various sessions, including "Opportunities in NSS" by Mohammed Jabir, "Andhashraddha" by Rajendra Koli, and "Solar Energy as an Alternative Source of Energy" by Zahid Khan. Additionally, Rohit Sharma also conducted a self-defense workshop, and Saurabh Shinde led a team-building session, while Sampai demonstrated judo and karate techniques. Camp was fully enjoyed by all the volunteers.

Extension Cell: Department of Lifelong Learning [DLLE]

The **Tree Plantation event**, organized by the Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE) at Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce on July 6, 2023, took place in Amar Nagar, Kurla. A passionate group of 12 participants came together to plant 25 saplings, highlighting the importance of environmental conservation and community engagement. This initiative aimed to enhance green cover while raising awareness about the critical role trees play in our ecosystem. The participants' enthusiasm and dedication made the event a great success, contributing to a greener and healthier environment.

In addition to the Tree Plantation event, the DLLE hosted a **Debate Competition** designed to strengthen students' oratory and critical thinking skills. Participants were assessed on their ability to construct persuasive arguments, effectively counter opposing views, and engage the audience. The competition saw vibrant participation from students across various courses. Noteworthy winners included Renuka Mandoura and Sehul in the Best Counter category, along with Iqra Khan and Saroj Gupta in the Best Speaker category, all demonstrating exceptional communication abilities.

The DLLE also organized a variety of other engaging activities, such as an **Online Quiz Competition**, **Potser competition**, **Slogan competition**, **Dandia Decoration competition**, **Rangoli competition**, and **T-shirt Painting**, all centered around social awareness. These events fostered creativity and active participation, reflecting the college's commitment to holistic development and community involvement.

Institution's Innovation Council:[IIC]

The College continued the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), an initiative by the Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Government of India, to foster innovation and entrepreneurship among students and faculty in higher education institutions. IIC conducted 18 successful sessions for faculties and students which was highly successful and met the expectations of participants. ICC conducted various activities such as State level Quiz Competition on "INdoWE", SNGC AVISHKAAR - Innovation & Entrepreneurship Outreach Programme for School Students, Online State Level Workshop on "Entrepreneurship and Innovation as a Career Opportunity", SHARK TANK SNGC, Essay Writing Competition on National Youth Day to mention a few.

The Food Fest organized by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) at Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce took place on January 23, 2024, from 8:00 am to 5:30 pm. The event aimed to provide students with an opportunity to showcase their entrepreneurial skills and explore the world of business management and there were 68 participants.

The institution's Innovation Council successfully conducted a workshop on "Entrepreneurship Skills Attitude and Behavior Development" on 16th February 2024. The workshop aimed to impart essential skills and foster the right mindset for individuals aspiring to enter the entrepreneurial domain. The workshop was conducted by Mr. Saranraj Natarajan, an esteemed Assistant Professor of the BMS Department and a distinguished member of the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC). Mr. Natarajan also serves as an Innovation Ambassador, bringing a wealth of knowledge and experience to the workshop. The workshop covered various aspects of entrepreneurship, including skills development, attitude shaping, and behaviour enhancement. The agenda included interactive sessions, discussions, and practical exercises to provide participants with a holistic understanding of the entrepreneurial journey.

CareerKatta Report:

Higher and Technical Education Department Government of Maharashtra in collaboration with the Maharashtra Information Technology Support Center (MITSC), inaugurated Career Katta on February 25th, 2021. This initiative is designed to foster entrepreneurship among students and provide support for their preparation for competitive examinations. Our college established the Career Katta Cell on January 17th, 2022. This cell is dedicated to providing comprehensive career counselling, competitive exam training, and fostering entrepreneurship skills among our students.

The Orientation Programme was organised on 12th August,2023 to provide information about the registration process of Career Katta, various courses offered, and benefits for registering under Career Katta. Career Sansand was formed in the College on 6th July, 2023 for the promotion and organisation of Career Katta activities as well as other activities of the College. **Samrudhi Shikshak Prashikashan Karyakram** (Career Katta Financial Literacy Training for teachers) was conducted 13/02/24 to 16/02/2024. Career Katta in collaboration with WDC organised Financial Literacy Workshop " **Introduction to Financial Planning**" on 12th March 2024 through zoom. Total 52 girl students attended the workshop. The resource person for the workshop was Mr. Jagadish Mane, SEBI Smart Trainer. "Akshaya Naarishakti Sangh" (Selfhelp Groups), A self-help group of 15 girl students was formed on 19th March 2024. First



meeting was held to decide the name, President and Secretary of the **Bachat Gat.** The students finalised the name of the group as Sakhi Samrudhi.

Mentoring:

The College improved student mentoring by organizing students based on their needs and creating small groups with appointed leaders. This structure enabled teachers to engage more effectively with each student. Throughout the year, consistent interactions with **group leaders** and students facilitated growth in knowledge, skills, and values. Keeping thorough records of mentoring sessions and providing regular reports enhanced the overall effectiveness of the mentoring program, ensuring that every student received the support necessary for their educational journey.

Career Counselling and Placement Cell activities:

The Placement Committee of Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce made significant impact in the academic year 2023-24, organizing a series of initiatives to boost student employability and foster connections with potential employers. The year's activities included pre-placement training workshops covering resume writing, interview skills, and aptitude test preparation, alongside guest lectures and industrial visits to leading companies. The highlight was the placement drive held on 2023-24, where total of **197** students were placed in various companies namely ICICI Lombard, Hexaware Technologies Pvt Ltd, State Street Syntel Services Pvt. Ltd, Thinksol Advisors LLP, Altruist Customer Management India Pvt. Ltd., Startek, Grofame Productions, Acura Solutions & Karur Vysya Bank, Axis Bank, VMK Foods. The highest package offered was ₹3.5 LPA. Additionally, the committee facilitated internships for more than 20 students, providing them with hands-on industry experience. Moving forward, the committee aims to expand its industry partnerships and offer even more career development opportunities for students.

Cultural Committee Activities:

Commencement of Academic Year and Welcoming New Students: The Academic year commenced from 15th June, 2023 according to the Government Circular. FYJC classes commenced from 07th August 2023 with an Orientation Programme for the students. Students were guided through a Power Point Presentation.

Financial Aid: College helped students to get all eligible freeship and scholarship from Govt. departments as well as from Private Trusts.

It identifies patterns, makes predictions, and adapts its behavior based on feedback.

This issue stems from the inadvertent incorporation of existing biases, leading to discriminatory outcomes, particularly affecting marginalized groups (Mittelstadt et al., 2016).

Solution: Addressing bias and promoting fairness requires a multifaceted approach. First, ensuring diverse and representative training data is essential to mitigate biases at their source. Transparency in the development process, coupled with explainable AI, aids in understanding and addressing algorithmic biases (Barocas and Selbst, 2016). Ongoing monitoring using bias detection tools is crucial to identify and rectify biases in real-time. Ethical guidelines and standards for AI development provide a framework to guide responsible practices, emphasizing the need for fairness considerations at every stage of the AI lifecycle. By implementing these solutions, we can work towards AI and ML systems that not only avoid perpetuating biases but actively contribute to a more equitable and just society.

Positive Example - Fairness in Facial Recognition: Case: In response to concerns about racial bias in facial recognition systems, IBM took a proactive approach. They publicly announced a commitment to eliminate biases in their AI technologies. The system, trained on resumes submitted over a 10-year period, showed a preference for male candidates. This case emphasizes the ethical challenges in AI systems perpetuating or amplifying societal biases. Amazon ultimately discontinued the tool, highlighting the importance of continuous monitoring and addressing bias in AI applications.

Transparency and Explainability

Transparency and explainability in AI and ML systems pose ethical challenges as many advanced algorithms operate as "black boxes," making it difficult to understand their decision-making processes. Lack of transparency can lead to a loss of trust, especially when these systems impact critical areas such as healthcare (Gerke et al., 2020), finance, or criminal justice. Users, stakeholders, and those affected by algorithmic decisions may feel uneasy or even disenfranchised when they cannot comprehend how and why a decision was reached.

Solution: To address this challenge, efforts should be directed toward enhancing transparency and explainability in AI and ML models. Implementing mechanisms that allow users to understand the reasoning behind algorithmic decisions promotes trust and accountability. This involves using interpretable models, providing clear documentation of algorithms, and ensuring that decision processes are accessible and understandable to a non-technical audience. Openly communicating the limitations and potential biases of AI systems contributes to informed and ethical use. Privacy and Data Security

In the realm of artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning (ML), the ethical quandary surrounding privacy and data security emerges as a pressing problem (Jobin et al, 2019). The extensive collection and processing of personal information by these technologies, often without explicit user consent, raise concerns about unauthorized access and potential misuse of sensitive data (Stahl, 2021).

Solution: This issue necessitates a comprehensive solution. Firstly, the establishment of robust legal frameworks is imperative to govern the ethical collection, storage, and sharing of personal data, ensuring transparency and empowering users with control over their information (Scarpino, 2022). Concurrently, integrating privacy-preserving techniques into AI and ML algorithms, such as federated learning and differential privacy, offers a viable solution to mitigate the risks associated with data breaches (Taddeo and Floridi, 2018). Ethical considerations must guide the entire lifecycle of AI and ML systems, from development to deployment, striking a delicate balance between technological innovation and the protection of individuals' privacy rights. Responsible AI Frameworks

Below are the real-world case studies where ethical considerations in AI and ML played a crucial role. *Positive Example - Tesla's Approach to Autopilot Safety: Case:* Tesla's Autopilot feature, which utilizes AI for autonomous driving, incorporates continuous learning and real-world data to enhance safety. Tesla actively collects data from its vehicles to improve the Autopilot system, prioritizing safety considerations. This case demonstrates the ethical responsibility of companies in the development of AI-driven technologies that have direct implications for public safety.

Negative Example - Uber's Algorithmic Pricing Discrimination: Case: Uber faced accusations of algorithmic pricing discrimination based on user demographics and location. Reports suggested that the ride-hailing platform used AI algorithms to set higher prices in affluent neighborhoods, potentially exploiting users' willingness to pay more. This case highlights the ethical concerns related to transparency, privacy, security and fairness in algorithmic decision-making, particularly in dynamic pricing models.

EMERGING ETHICAL CHALLENGES IN AI AND ML

Autonomous Weapons

Introduction: Autonomous weapons, also known as lethal autonomous weapons systems (LAWS), refer to weaponry that employs artificial intelligence to make critical decisions without direct human intervention (Taddeo and Blanchard, 2022). The integration of AI in weaponry raises significant ethical concerns, necessitating a thorough exploration of its implications (Reddy, 2016). The ethical Implications are as under:

Lack of Human Oversight: The use of AI in autonomous weapons removes the human element from decision-making, leading to concerns about accountability and the potential for unintended consequences (Bächle and Bareis, 2022).

Target Identification and Discrimination: AI-powered systems may struggle with accurate target identification, potentially leading to civilian casualties or violations of international humanitarian law.

Escalation of Warfare: The deployment of autonomous weapons could lead to an escalation of conflicts as nations might be more inclined to use such systems in warfare, considering reduced risk to their own personnel (Dresp-Langley, 2023).

There is a need of regulation of autonomous weapons in terms of:

International Agreements: The international community faces the challenge of establishing comprehensive agreements to regulate the development and deployment of autonomous weapons, similar to existing arms control treaties (Yordan et al., 2022).



Ethical Frameworks: Developing ethical frameworks that prioritize human rights, minimize harm, and prevent the indiscriminate use of AI in warfare (Dean, 2022 and Geneva, 2018).

Ban or Moratorium: Consideration of a temporary ban or moratorium on the development of certain types of autonomous weapons until a robust ethical and legal framework is established (Leys, 2018).

Deepfakes

Deepfakes involve the use of AI and machine learning algorithms to create realistic-looking or voice but entirely fabricated, content—typically images or videos (Johnson and Johnson, 2023). This technology raises ethical concerns related to misinformation, privacy invasion, and the erosion of trust. Actor Val Kilmer lost his distinctive voice to throat cancer in 2015, but Deepfake technology was recently used to allow Kilmer to "speak." (The actor's son was brought to tears upon hearing his father's "voice" again) (Lalla et al., 2022). The ethical Concerns of the above are:

Misinformation and Manipulation: Deepfakes can be used to create convincing fake content that can spread false information, influence public opinion, and even manipulate political discourse (Bizzaccenknnect, 2023).

Erosion of Trust: The widespread use of deepfakes can erode public trust in visual media, making it challenging to discern between authentic and manipulated content (Helmus, 2022).

Few mitigation strategies to avoid the risk of deepflakes are:

Detection Algorithms: Development of advanced algorithms to detect deepfake content and prevent its dissemination on various platforms (Nishimura, 2023).

Legislation and Regulation: Implementation of legal frameworks to deter the creation and distribution of malicious deepfakes, with consequences for those found responsible (Dahiya, 2023)

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, the dynamic landscape of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML) brings transformative potential alongside ethical challenges. AI's broad scope and ML's specific role intertwine, shaping technological progress. Ethical considerations, including bias, transparency, and privacy, necessitate multifaceted solutions exemplified by real-world cases. Anticipating emerging challenges in Autonomous Weapons and Deepfakes underscores the importance of international agreements and proactive measures. Striking a balance between innovation and ethics is paramount, urging responsible AI frameworks and heightened awareness to navigate the evolving intersection of technology and morality.

Key Activities of IQAC for 2023-24

1. Sessions

IQAC facilitated impactful sessions to enhance students' knowledge, life skills, and professional readiness:

The Research Cell aims to nurture research culture in the students and faculties. This enhances the general research capability of budding technocrats by way of participating in conferences, seminars, workshops, project competition, FDP's etc.

Following are the activities conducted by the cell in the academic year 2023-24.

- 1. A National Level Research workshop on Preparing Effective Research proposal & Funding Agencies for Sponsorship was held on 29th July 2023 from 11.00 am to 1.00 am through Google Meet Platform, by Sree Narayana Guru College of Commerce IQAC and Research Cell in association with Sree Narayana Guru College of Education (B.Ed.) The Keynote Speaker was Dr. Maushmi Datta, the Principal of Nagindas Khandwala College (Autonomous).
- 2. 6. Emerging Trends in HR in the Corporate Sector



Following activities were conducted by Women Development Cell in 2023-24







